Did you know ?

The female Australian Brushturkey has a small yellow collar, and are smaller overall than the males. The female Brushturkeys are not the mound builders. The female Brushturkey lays up to 18 eggs per year, often laying eggs in different nests. Multiple females can also lay eggs in the same mound, often with eggs fertilised by males from other mounds.

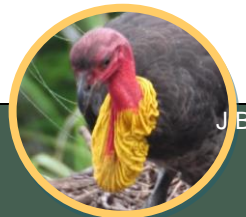

- 252 (38%) have mounds nearby
