## QUEENSLAND BIRD REPORT, 1983

## INTRODUCTION

The first Queensland Annual Bird Report presents a selection of the State's more interesting bird records for the calendar year of 1983. It proved to be a good year, with six species added or confirmed for the State List : Cook's Petrel, Buller's Shearwater, Ringed Plover, Dunlin, White-necked Petrel, Redrumped Swallow, the last two new also for Australia. Other highlights included Providence Petrel, Black-winged Petrel, Slender-billed Prion, White-tailed Tropicbird, and Plains-wanderer.

The year began with the continuation of a severe drought, which no doubt explained the unusual concentrations of water birds in the south-east. The breaking of the drought was followed by an exceptionally wet winter, which saw the end of that influx, and ruined the wader prospects for the following seasons.

Records submitted have been vetted by the compiler, and an informal committee. Especially, unusual reports have not been included unless substantiated by detailed fieldnotes, specimen or photograph. Exclusion from this Bird Report in no way implies that a record was considered erroneous.

Nomenclature follows the R.A.O.U. Recommended English Names for Australian Birds (1978) Emu 77 Supplement). Localities are followed in parentheses, by a regional classification which follows Dahms (1978 Memoirs of the queensland Museum). In the Systematic List, initials of the observers appear after the dates of their observations. A list of observers and their initials appears below. Abbreviations used are:

## SYSTEMATIC LIST

Great-crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus. Many records received from SEQ, with c. 600 on Somerset Dam (SEQ) July 27 ST, being the most outstanding record; also two birds at Lake Corella (WCQ) May 25 JW.

Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus. Common in SEQ, especially in the Brisbane Valley, (SEQ) during the first half of the year. Virtually absent in the second half.

Black-browed Albatross Diomedea melanophris. Single birds off Pt. Lookout (SEQ) May 25, June 12 \& 13, July 11, 16 \& 17, Sept. 25 CC, TP, DAS: Two bw on Eastern Beach (Moreton Is SEQ) June 25; one bw on Ocean Beach (Moreton Is SEQ) during July, both VB. All specimens in QM.

Shy Albatross Diomedea cauta. Single bird off Pt. Lookout July 11 CC, GD, GI, TP, DAS.

Southern Giant-Petrel Macronectes giganteus. One bird off Pt. Lookout July $11 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{GD}, \mathrm{GI}, \mathrm{TP}, \mathrm{DAS}$; one found bw on Eastern Beach (Moreton Is) June 25 VB.

White-necked Petrel Pterodroma cervicalis. Single bird off Pt. Lookout Feb 20 CC, AM, TP, AS, DAS - first Australian record. Smyth, A.K. and Corben, C. 1984. Seabird observations on North Stradbroke Island. In Focus on Stradbroke (R.J. Coleman, J. Covacevich, P. Davie ed.) pp 363-369. Brisbane: Boolarong Publ.

Great-winged Petrel Pterodroma macroptera. Single bird off Pt. Lookout June 5 CC, TP, DAS; one bw on Main Beach (N. Stradbroke Is) during July AGT, GI.

Providence Petrel Pterodroma solandri. One off Pt. Lookout June 5 CC, TP; one bw on Frenchmans Beach (N. Stradbroke Is SEQ) June 14 LW . Specimen in QM; several sightings from Pt. Lookout July 16 \& 17 CC, GD, GI, DAS.

Tahiti Petrel Pterodroma rostrata. Two seen on edge of continental shelf off C. Moreton (SEQ) QOS Boat Trip.

Black-winged Petrel Pterodroma nigripennis. Single bird off Pt. Lookout Dec. 29 CC, AS.

Cook's Petrel Pterodroma cookii. Single bird off Pt. Lookout Feb 20 CC, AM, AS, DAS, first Queensland record.

Slender-billed Prion Pachyptila belcheri. Three off Pt. Lookout July 11 CC, GD, GI, TP, DAS; one from same locality July 17 CC, GD, GI, DAS. (4th \& 5th Queensland records respectively).

Fairy Prion Pachyptila turtur. Two bw near Rainbow Beach (SEQ) July 7 DAS; many birds off Pt. Lookout July 9 \& 10 CC, GD, TP, DAS; and July 17 CC, GD, GI, DAS.

Flesh-footed Shearwater Puffinus carneipes. All sight records from Pt. Lookout: one on Feb 1 CC ; two on Feb 6 CC, AS; five on Feb 19 \& 20 CC , AM, TP, AS, DAS, DAS; ten on Sept $25 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{TP}$, DAS; one on Dec 11 CC ; one on Dec 24 \& $25 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{AS}$; c. 30 on Dec 26 CC, AS.

Wedge-tailed Shearwater Puffinus pacificus. Small colony breeding at Camel Rock (N. Stradbroke Is) Jan 5, and still present March 31 HH . This is the most southerly breeding record in Queensland, for the species.

Buller's Shearwater Puffinus bulleri. Single bird off Pt. Lookout Jan 1 CC, TC, AS - first Queensland Record; two off Pt. Lookout Dec 29 CC, AS. ibid.

Streaked Shearwater Calonectris leucomelas. Single bird off Pt. Lookout: March $1 \& 2 \mathrm{~KB}, \mathrm{DE}$ and Dec 25 CC , AS. ibid.

Fluttering Shearwater Puffinus gavia. One bw on Moreton Is Aug 4 VB , specimen in QM .

Hutton's Shearwater Puffinus huttoni. All sightings off Pt. Lookout: one on April 10 CC, GD, DAS; three on June 5 CC, TP, DAS; one on June 13 CC, DJ, DAS; four on July 11 CC, GD, DAS; two on July 16 CC, GD, GI, DAS; five on July 17 CC, GD, GI, DAS; one on Aug 7 CC, TP, DAS.

Little Shearwater Puffinus assimils. One bw on Main Beach (N. Stradbroke Is) during July AGT, GI.

Wilson's Storm-Petrel Oceanites oceanicus. Seven seen at edge of continental shelf off C. Moreton Oct 15 QOS Boat Trip; also at same locality Nov 12 QOS Boat Trip.

White-faced Storm-Petrel Pelagodroma marina. One bw on Main Beach (N. Stradbroke Is) during July AGT, GI.

Australasian Gannet Marus serrator. Observed at Great Keppel Is (MEQ) June 21 PM ; one juvenile off Heron Is (MEQ) July 11 DE.

Masked Booby Sula dactylatra. All sightings of single birds off Pt. Lookout: Jan 1 \& 2 TC, CC, AS, DAS; Feb 6 CC, TP, AS; Feb 19 CC, AM, TP, AS, DS, DAS; March 3 KB , DE, JI, GH; March 5 BF, PMC, TR; April 4 HH ; one bw on Main Beach (N. Stradbroke Is) May 2 CC, TP, DAS.

Lesser Frigatebird Fregata ariel. All sightings off Pt. Lookout. One Jan 1 TC, CC, AS, DAS; two Feb 2 CC, TP, AS; one March 1 KB, DE, JI, GH; two March 2 KB, $\mathrm{DE}, \mathrm{JI}, \mathrm{GH}$; four April 4 HH ; one May $1 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{TP}, \mathrm{AS}$, DAS; one Dec $29 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{AS}$.

White-tailed Tropicbird Phaethon lepturus. Single bird bw near Eager Swamp (Moreton Is) Jan 10 JC , now in QM.

Little Bittern Ixobrychus minutus. One near Tamborine Village (SEQ) March 27 TP ; one near Redcliffe Airport (SEQ) Dec $15 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{GD}, \mathrm{DJ}, \mathrm{AS}, \mathrm{DAS}$; one at Lytton (SEQ) Dec 29 CC, AS.

Black Bittern Dupetor flavicollis. One at St. Lawrence (MEQ) Dec 14 ES.

Black-necked Stork Zenorhynchus asiaticus. Recorded breeding at Bald Hills (SEQ) during the year by many observers.

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falicinellus. Widespread in SEQ in the first half of the year, but apparently absent from SEQ in the second half.

Magpie Goose Ahseranas semipalmatus. 88 at Atkinson's Dam (SEQ) mid Jan IV, still present Jan 22 CC, TP, AS; seven at Albany Creek (SEQ) April 2 D\&NA; 18 at Sandgate Lagoon (SEQ) Oct 29 ES; four at Oxenford (SEQ) ES. This species had been absent from SEQ for many years.

Wandering Whistling-Duck Dendrocygna arcuata. Present in larger numbers than usual in SEQ in first half of the year. About 10 birds at Lytton all year.

Black Swan Cygnus atratus. 245 at Samsonvale (SEQ) Nov 20 ES; eight at Lake Moondarra (Mt. Isa WCQ) Dec 1 ES.

Freckled Duck Strictonetta naevosa. Small invasion into SEQ in Jan \& Feb (only significant or maximum numbers are given for each locality). One at Hood's Lagoon (SEQ) Jan 3 MA, PMC; 34 at Seven Mile Lagoon (SEQ) during Jan CC, DS; five at Hood's Lagoon Jan 15 TR; eight at Krasches Lagoon (SEQ) Jan 30 MA ; one at Gooby Dam (SEQ) Jan 31 MA; last record for SEQ was one at Hood's Lagoon Feb 26 MA; also reported from Dynevor Lake (SWQ) Sept. 24 BJ; and same locality Dec 27 GD, BF, TR, DAS.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides. Single bird at Dyer's Lagoon (SEQ) March 1 PMC, TR.

Radjah Shelduck Tadarna radjah. Four on the Cairns Esplanade (NEQ) Sept. 1 DM; eight at St. Lawrence Dec 14 ES.

Australian Shoveller Anas rhynchotis. Single bird at Hasties Swamp (NEQ) May 1 DM.

Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus. Another species numerous during the first half of the year in SEQ, with numbers decreasing in the last half. C. 100 recorded at Geera (CQ) Nov 25 ES; 12 at Lake Moondarra Dec 1 ES.

Cotton Pygmy-Goose Nettapus coramandelianus. Present at Aitkinson's Dam Jan, Feb, Oct, Nov and Dec, with maximum of ten Dec $18 \mathrm{~KB}, \mathrm{GR}$, AS, DAS; numerous around Biloela (SEQ) between March 15 and May 1 PMC; two at Lake Clarendon (SEQ) Sept 18 ES.

Green Pygmy-Goose Nettapus pulchellus. 12 at Lake Moondarra Dec 1 ES.

Musk Duck Biziura lobata. One at Atkinson's Dam Jan 22 $\mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{AS}$; one near Beerwah (SEQ) Feb 6 GC , DAS; one on N. Stradbroke Is May 2 CC, TP, AS, DAS; one at Lake Clarendon Aug 17 ES; one at Dynevor Lakes Sept 24 BJ; one at Hood's Lagoon Dec 19 MA.

Pacific Baza Aviceda subcristata. Single bird near St. George (SCQ) Nov 15 BO.

Black Kite Miluus migrans. Several SEQ records, all in first half of year. One east of South Brook (SEQ) Feb 25 MA ; one at Kallangur (SEQ) March 21 JN; two at Morayfield (SEQ) March 30 DAS; one at Moogerah (SEQ) April 16 PM; one at Burpengary (SEQ) May 30 GC ; one two km east of Caboolture (SEQ) June 2 GC ; one at Banyo Cemetary (SEQ) late July PC.

Square-tailed Kite Lophoictinia isura. One at Julatten (NEQ) April 3 AD, AM; one at Kenmore (SEQ) April 25 PM; one near Boonooroo (SEQ) Aug 13 CC et al; one near Moonie (SCQ) Oct 10 PMC, DAS.

Black-breasted Kite Hamirostra melanosternon. Single bird near Quilpie (SWQ) April 1 MA, PMC, TP, TR; reported between "South Plains" and Lake Eliza (SCQ), and between Cunnamulla and Thargomindah (SW'Q) during Sept IV et al.

Red Goshawk Accipiter radiatus. One south of Bundaberg (SEQ) Feb $26 \mathrm{BF}, \mathrm{PMC}, \mathrm{TR}$; one at "Egypt" (via Helidon SEQ) June 11 \& 12 GC.

Black Falcon Falco subniger. Two 5 km west of Wyeema (SEQ) Jan 17 MA ; single birds at Lake Clarendon, Seven Mile Lagoon Jan 28 CC, AS; one at Lake Broadwater (SEQ) April 7 MW ; one at Samford Swamp (SEQ) Aug 14 ES.

Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus. Recorded between "Bullawarra" and Carr's Hill (SWQ), and between "Kyeenee" and Yowah (SWQ) during Sept IV et al

Australian Hobby Falco longipennis. Single birds at Archerfield (SEQ) April 9, along Herston Rd (SEQ) July 8, both ES.

Grey Falcon Falco hypoleucos. One at Seven Mile Lagoon Jan 22 CC, AS; also between Cunnamulla and Thargomindah, between "Kyeenee" and Yowah, and between Quilpie and "Wallumbilla" (SWQ) during Sept IV et al.

Brown Quail Coturnix australis. Two at Mica Creek (Mt. Isa WCQ) Nov 30 ES.

King Quail Coturnix chinensis. One pair near North Pine Dam (SEQ) Oct 23 GL, HH.

Black-breasted Button-quail Turnix velox. Parties of eight and six near Little Yabba Creek (Conondale Range SEQ) May 19 \& 21 GR; two at Ravensbourne NP (SEQ) May 30 PMC; two near Little Yabba Creek Sept 17 DAS.

Red-chested Button-quail Turnix pyrrhotharax. Single bird flushed from edge of Atkinson's Dam Jan 28 CC ; one at Biloela May 7 PMC.

Plains-wanderer Pedionomus torquatus. Two at Davenport Downs (SWQ) one juvenile collected (now in QM) July 11 RA, GP, DR. Second record for Queensland in recent times, both have been in the Channel Country.

Buff-banded Rail Rallus phillippensis. Breeding at Pinkenba (SEQ) Nov 20 ES.

Lewin's Rail Rallus pectoralis. One female dead at Mt. Belthorpe (SEQ) Sept 15 TP ; another dead near the Cairns Esplanade Oct 16 DM.

Baillon's Crake Parzana pusilla. Recorded at Hood's Lagoon Jan 15 TR ; one near Tamborine (SEQ) Oct 19 TP ; one at the Sherwood Arboretum (SEQ) Nov 12 ES.

Australian Crake Porzana fluminea. Two near Tamborine Oct 19 TP; one collected at Davenport Downs Nov 14 RA, GP, specimen in QM .

Spotless Crake Porzana tabuensis. One at Lytton March 20 GL ; one near Tamborine March 27 TP ; one near Redcliffe Airport Dec 18 CC, GD, AS, DAS.

Bush-hen Gallinula olivacea. One near Beerwah Feb 6 GC, DAS.

Black-tailed Native-hen Gallinula ventralis. One at Atkinson's Dam Feb 12 DAS. First record for SEQ; c. 50 at Fort Constantine (North of Cloncurry WCQ) March 6 JW.

Purple Swamphen Porphyrio porphyrio. One at Lake Corella Dec 4 ES.

Brolga Grus rubicundus. Two at Lytton April 4 GP ; also 100 km south of Thargomindah Aug 30 AM , DS; one at Brisbane Airport Sept 22 ES.

Australian Bustard Ardeotis australis. One at Biloela March 22, and May 9 PMC; two 40 km west of Windorah (SWQ) April 3 MA.

Bush Thick-knee Burhinus magnirostris. One breeding record from Brookfield (SEQ) Nov 2 JY.

Beach Thick-knee Burhinus neglectus. One on Bribie Is (SEQ) March 16 JN ; one on Great Keppel Is June 21 PM.

Painted Snipe Rostratula benghalensis. One at Hood's Lagoon Jan $1 \mathrm{MA}, \mathrm{PMC}$; three (two males and one female) at Atkinson's Dam Jan 28 AS; two Feb 13 CC , TP, DAS and one June 13 TP.

Masked Lapwing Vanellus miles. One bird of northern race V.m. miles recorded at Seven Mile Lagoon Jan 22 CC, AS.

Red-kneed Dotteral Erythrogonys cinctus. Recorded in first half year, in SEQ, apparently absent from SEQ in second half. Also recorded between Beetoota and Birdsville (SWQ) Feb 19 to 26 GC.

Ringed Plover Charadrius hiaticula. One at Boonooroo July 17 D\&JL. First Queensland record. Seen by many people, with the last being Aug $23 \mathrm{MA}, \mathrm{PMC}$.

Large Sand-Plover Charadrius leschenaultii. Present in large numbers only at Scarborough (SEQ) and Thornside (SEQ).

Oriental Plover Charadrius veredus. Two at "X" Waterhole, via Durrie (SWQ) Feb 21 GC; one on the Cairns Esplanade during Aug JCr.

Inland Dotteral Peltohyas australis. Six 36 km west of Thargomindah Aug 29 AM, DS; 1430 km west of Bulloo Downs (SWQ) Aug 31 AM, DS.

Red-necked Avocet Recurvirostra novachollandial. Recorded at various locations in SEQ during Feb, March, April and Dec, with a maximum of c. 200 at Lytton during April GPi.

Little Whimbrel Numenius minutus. 27 at Luggage Point (SEQ) Oct 17 DJ, BO, DAS; one near the Cairns Esplanade from Nov 5 to 10, and another in grounds of Cairns Hospital (NEQ) Nov 5 to Dec 3, both DM.

Wood Sandpiper Tringa glareola. Two at Tommy Dontra Waterhole, Glengyle St. (SWQ) Feb 26 GC.

Common Sandpiper Tringa hypoleucos. One at Dunwich (SEQ) Feb 5 TP; one at Pierikoola Waterhole (SEQ) Feb 20 GC ; one near the mouth of the Brisbane River (SEQ) Nov 5 AS; one at Luggage Point Dec 2 GD, BO, DAS.

Asian Dowitcher Limnodromus semipalmatus. Single birds at Lytton Jan 3 TP, IV; five Jan 6 AS , RB, Dec 17 CC , DJ, BO, DAS.

Curlew Sandpiper Calidris ferruginea. Recorded at Mt. Leonard Tank (Beetoota SWQ) Feb 18, Pierikoola Waterhole Feb 20, Tommy Dontra Waterhole Glengyle St. Feb 26 all GC; also at Barcaldine (WCQ) Sept 26 HH ; between "South Plains" and Lake Eliza during Sept IV et al.

Dunlin Calidris alpina. Single bird observed on the Cairns Esplanade Jan 4 GR, first Queensland record. Roberts G. 1983. Sighting of Dunlin Calidris alpina in North Queensland and a review of Australian Dunlin records. Sunbird 13:1519.

Sanderling Calidris alba. 14 birds at Amity Point (SEQ) May 8 CC, TP, NP, DAS; 13 on the Main Beach (N. Stradbroke Is) June $12 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{BF}, \mathrm{DJ}, \mathrm{PMC}, \mathrm{TP}, \mathrm{TR}$, DAS; two at Scarborough Oct 9 DAS and four Oct 29 CC, DAS.

Broad-billed Sandpiper Limicola falcinellus. Two at Clontarf (SEQ) Feb 7 DAS; one at same locality Feb 21 DAS; two at Scarborough March $5 \mathrm{~KB}, \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{DE}, \mathrm{DAS}$; one at Luggage Point May 7 CC, NP, DAS.

Ruff Philomachus pugnax. One at Myrtletown Oct 15 ES.
Australian Pratincole Stiltia isabella. c. 600 at Cloncurry Airport (WCQ) Dec 30 JW.

Silver Gull Larus novaehollandiae. Recorded at Lake Broadwater Apr 7 MW .

White-winged Black Tern Chlidonias leucoptera. 20 at Samsonvale (SEQ) many in alternate plumage April 4 ES; 40 recorded near Brisbane Airport April 30 ES; 100 at Myrtletown May 2 and five May 7, all in alternate plumage ES.

Common Tern Sterna hirundo. Winter records include 38 birds at Redcliffe July 4 CC, DE, DAS; 15 Aug 1 DAS; also at Pt. Lookout Sept $11 \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{TP}, \mathrm{SB}, \mathrm{BO}$, DAS.

Arctic Tern Sterna paradisaea. Single bird off Pt. Lookout June $11,12 \& 13$, July $10 \& 11$, Aug 7 CC, GD, TP, DAS. Smyth, A. and Corben, C. op cit.

Roseate Tern Sterna dougallii. Maximum of six birds on Heron Is, two in alternate plumage June 6 AS and four in various plumages July 7-12 DE, AS.

Redthroat Sericornis brunneus. Two 38 km east of Adavale April 3 MA, PMC, TP, TR; observed at same locality Aug 28 AM, DS.

Western Gerygone Gerygone fusca. Recorded between "South Plains" and Lake Eliza, and between Thargomindah and "Kyeenee" during Sept IV et al.

Yellow Chat Ephthianura croceasingle bird collected on Davenport Downs Dec 8 RA, GP, specimen in QM.

Gibber Chat Ashbyia lovensis. One male near Grey Range (SWQ) Aug 30 AM, DS.

House Sparrow Passer domesticus. Flock of up to 11 birds on Heron Is June 6-13, July 7-27 AS.

Painted Finch Emblema picta. Four at Fort Williams St. (via Boulia WCQ) April 4; one 15 km south-west of Cloncurry (WCQ) Dec 23, both JW.

Plum-headed Finch Aidemosyne modesta. c. 500 at Wivenhoe Crossing Jan 28 PL, AS; c. 80 observed 30 km west of Goondiwindi Aug 27 AM, DS; two at Helidon Nov 20 MA.

Blue-faced Finch Erythrura trichroa. Up to ten at Mt. Lewis March $3 \mathrm{~KB}, \mathrm{HB}, \mathrm{CC}, \mathrm{DE}, \mathrm{GI}, \mathrm{GR}$, DAS; three at Jullatten March 2, and two at Mt. Lewis March 3, both AD, AM; present at Mt. Lewis and Jullatten during March/ April DM.

Figbird Sphecotheres viridis. Recorded at Mitchell (SCQ) Sept 22 R\&LS.

Little Woodswallow Artamus minor. Records from SEQ include: one on Bribie Is Jan 9; two at Toorbil Jan 23 \& 24; also breeding at "Egypt" during Nov, all GC.

# NESTING OF THE WEDGE-TAILED SHEARWATER ON MUDJIMBA ISLAND, QUEENSLAND 

S.G. LANE AND H. BATTAM

The Wedge-tailed Shearwater Puffinus pacificus is recorded breeding in Queensland from Raine Island in the north to Lady Elliott Island in the south (Serventy et al. 1971). Neither the R.A.O.U. Nest Record Scheme nor the Australian Atlas Scheme has any breeding record of this species in Queensland south of Lady Elliott Island in the Bunker Group. However, these birds were reported by Hines (1983) to be breeding at Point Lookout, North Stradbroke Island, in March 1983. About 20 pairs were nesting there again in the 1983/84 season (Smyth and Corben, 1984).

One of us (H.B.), while holidaying at Maroochydore in December 1980, considered that a small island about one
kilometre from the coast and just north of Maroochydore looked suitable for shearwaters. Although we discussed the possibility of visiting the island, we were not able to until February 1984.
The island is Mudjimba or Old Woman Island and is about one hectare in area. It is privately leased and, with the approval of the owner, we visited it for three hours on 15 February 1984. Even though it was quite calm, landing was difficult due to numerous submerged rocks and the surge around the small island.
Shearwater burrows were well spread over the sloping "plateau" on the island and averaged about one per square metre. We searched 291 burrows during the brief visit. Of these, five contained a cold (addled) egg, three were freshly dug, 38 were too deep to check, 174 were empty and 51 contained a downy Wedge-tailed Shearwater chick. The weight of the chicks ( 46 weighed) ranged from 205 g to 470 g with a mean of 308 g (standard error $\pm 8.27 \mathrm{~g}$ ).
From an estimation of the area of the burrowed part of the island and the fact that we searched about one burrow in six or eight, we estimated that there were between 1500 and 2000 burrows on the island.

## BOOK REVIEW

JOHN GOULD AND THE BIRDS OF AUSTRALIA - A SUMMARY OF GOULD'S WORK IN AUSTRALIA AND A HISTORY OF THE LEAGUE WHICH BEARS HIS NAME
by C.F. Jenkins, 1983. Gould League, Perth. 132 pages. This book is the result of a request from the Council of the West Australian Gould League to Mr. Jenkins to write the history of the League.
Mr. Jenkins has written a short biography of John Gould, the man after whom the League was named. This gives an insight into Gould's character as well as a chronological account of his work and journeys in various countries and in Australia. Mr. Jenkins portrays him as a good business-man, clever taxidermist and above all, what Bill Oddie describes as a "twitcher"! Gould is reported to have said, "I say (send them to me) immediately you receive them, because novelties get described elsewhere before I have had an opportunity of selling them".

The inevitable analogy between Gould and Audubon is indicated, and a rather tedious albeit detailed account of the complete works of Gould is presented. Chapters on his wife (who finished many of his paintings), his family and close friends contain some interesting anecdotes.
Mr. Jenkins presents short histories of those Leagues formed in various states, and finally the detailed story of the Western Australian Gould League. Mention is made of Olive Seymour who was the first full-time Secretary of the W.A. League, and there are three colour plates of her bird paintings.

More than half the book presents extracts from "Gould League Notes", the major publication of the W.A. League. Many of these are obsolete and would perhaps have been best omitted. They apparently were included as examples of the influence the League had on natural history studies in W.A. schools.
This book will, no doubt, have a degree of appeal in those states where the League exists, particularly West Australia. The recommended price is $\$ 9.95$, a little expensive for what it offers. It can be obtained from the Gould League of W.A. at the Zoo Education Centre, Labouchere Rd., South Perth 6151. Brisbane stores do not stock it.

2. It should be quite apparent that this is one of the small, "plumed" honeyeaters of the genus Lichenostomus. The possibilities are Purple-gaped L. cratitius, Fuscous L. fuscus, Yellow-tinted L. flavescens, White-plumed L. penicillata, Grey-headed L. keartlandi, Grey-fronted L. plumula and Yellow-plumed L. ornatus. Even in this blurry photo, extensively dark lores and a broad, pale "plume" are evident, narrowing the field to the latter three.

The ventral streaking is nowhere near bold enough for Yellow-plumed and the "plume" is too narrow for Grey-fronted which has the broadest of any of these species. So this bird is a Grey-headed.

This identification is also supported by the general head pattern, in that the yellow "plume" is sharply defined along its anterior edge by a curved black line but merges into the malar region and throat at its lower end. This comes about because the species shows a sharp
 contrast between the generally dark face and the light yellow throat. The resulting pattern, in which the "plume" appears as an upswept extension of the pale malar region, is quite diagnostic of Grey-headed.

This particular Grey-headed was photographed by me at Mt. Isa in November 1975.
