THE QUEENSLAND ORNITHOLOGICAL SOCIETY BIRD REPORT, 1984

TONY PALLISER

This second annual QOS Bird Report presents a selection of the State's more interesting bird records for the calendar year of 1984. It is encouraging to note that the number of records received and the number of observers sending them have substantially increased since the 1983 report (Stewart 1984) It is hoped this trend will continue into future years.

Perhaps the most exciting event of 1984 was the addition of two new species for Queensland, namely Soft-plumaged Petrel and Lesser Yellowlegs. The latter being the second record for Australia. The continued visits by Magpie Geese to South-East Queensland, in spite of the drought breaking, suggests these are due to factors other than the climate. Point Lookout on North Stradbroke Island continues to supply the State with interesting seabird sightings. In South-East Queensland waders were down in numbers with the exception of a small influx of Broad-billed Sandpipers.

METHODS

Records submitted have been vetted by the compiler and an informal committee. Especially unusual reports have not been included unless substantiated by detailed field notes, specimens or photographs.

In addition to those sent to QOS other records were gained by searching the following newsletters: Australian Birding Association, Cosmic Flashes (April '84 to June '85); The Bird Observers

Club Newsletter (April '84 to March '85); Queensland Ornithological Society Newsletter (Feb. '84 to May '85); RAOU Newsletter (March '84 to March '85); and Urimbirra (Feb. '84 to Dec. '84).

Exclusion from this bird report in no way implies that a record was considered erroneous.

Nomenclature follows the RAOU (1978) with the exception of White-necked Petrel Pterodroma cervicalis which is now split from the Juan Fernandez Petrel Pterodroma externa (Imber 1985) and the Bassian Thrush Zoothera lunulata split from White's Thrush Zoothera dauma by Ford (1983).




FIG. 1. Queensland districts mentioned in the text.

Details of the location are only given with the first reference to that location but the region of each sighting is shown in parentheses in the Systematic List. For locations see Readers Digest (1977). The regions are shown in Fig. 1. and follow Dahms (1978). Initials of the observers appear after the dates of their observations. A list of observers and their initials appears below.



- Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus. Many records received from SEQ, all being of small numbers in winter months from Lake Clarendon, Atkinson Dam, Somerset Dam and Samsonvale; also (2) birds at Lake Nuga Nuga in the Arcadia Valley (SEQ) OCT. 11 ES.
- Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus. Smaller numbers than usual, largest count was of c.20 birds at Seven Mile Lagoon (SEQ) March 25 CPY; Recorded at McAllister Station, SW of Normanton (NCQ) in Sept. NW.
- Little Penguin Eudyptula minor. (1) bird found alive on Main Beach, N Stradbroke I. during an Army exercise April 8; (1) on Heron I. (SEQ) in late June JK (also on TV news).
- Black-browed Albatross Diomedea melanophrys. (1) sighted from Pt. Danger (SEQ) May 19 CC, AS; (5) birds off Pt. Lookout, N Stradbroke I. May 20 TP, RD.
- Giant Petrel Macronectes sp. (1) bird at Michaelmas Cay (NEQ) well north of its normal range June 30 RBR; (1) sighted from Pt. Lookout July 8 CC, TP, AS, DAS.
- Southern Giant-Petrel Macronectes giganteus. (1) bird bw Sunshine Beach (SEQ) Aug. 6 R&JE (specimen in QM).
- Northern Giant-Petrel Macronectes halli. (1) bird bw Southport Spit (SEQ) Aug. 5 JVC, AD (specimen in QM).
- White-headed Petrel Pterodroma lessonii. (1) bird bw Moreton Island (SEQ) Sept. 13 AW (specimen in QM).
- White-necked Petrel Pterodroma cervicalis. The increased sightings of this bird suggest it may not be as rare as previously supposed. (1) bird off Pt. Lookout, Feb. 11 QOS boat trip; (1) Feb. 19 CC, TP, AS, DAS; (1) bird flying over a flooded paddock c.1 km N of Mudgeeraba (SEQ) April 9 CC, TP, AS, DAS.
- Providence Petrel Pterodroma solandri. Single birds sighted from Pt. Lookout May 20 RD, TP and July 15 CC, TP. AS.

- Tahiti Petrel Pterodroma rostrata. (1) seen on edge of continental shelf off N Stradbroke I. (SEQ) Feb. 11 QOS boat trip.
- Soft-plumaged Petrel Pterodroma mollis. (1) found alive at Maryborough (SEQ) July 20 and subsequently died five days later. Specimen lodged in QM. This being the first Queensland Record (The Bird Observer 632, p92 F & T Smith).
- Gould's Petrel Pterodroma leucoptera. (3) sighted off Pt. Lookout Feb. 11 QOS boat trip.
- Prion Pachyptila sp. (1) unidentified bird sighted off Pt. Lookout July 8 CC, TP, AS, DAS.
- Petrel Procellaria sp. (1) either P. westlandica or P. aequinoctialis off Pt. Lookout July 15 CC, TP, AS.
- Streaked Shearwater Calonectris leucomelas. Sightings from Pt. Lookout include (17) Feb. 19 CC, TP, AS, DAS; (29) March 10 CC, AS; (6) March 19 KB, CC, TP; (1) March 17 QUOS boat trip; (1) bird off Caloundra Head (SEQ) March 25 DAS.

- Wilson's Storm-petrel Oceanites oceanicus. (1) off Pt. Lookout April 14 CC, TP, DAS, AS.
- White-bellied Storm-Petrel Fregetta grallaria. (1) sighted near Flat Rock off Pt. Lookout Feb. 11 QOS boat trip.
- Australian Gannet Morus servator. (249) counted in 15 minutes off Wickham Pt. near Caloundra (SEQ) May 28 HB.
- Masked Booby Sula dactylatra. (1) sighted off Caloundra (SEQ) July 23 HB.
- **Brown Booby** Sula Leucogaster. (4) individuals sighted at Scarborough (SEQ) July 4 PM.
- Least Frigatebird Fregata ariel. All sightings from Pt. Lookout (7) Jan. 30, AD,GP; (1) March 10 CC, AS.
- Red-Tailed Tropicbird Phaethon rubricauda. (1) sighted off Shelly Beach, Caloundra (SEQ) July 27 HB.
- White-tailed Tropicbird Phaethon Leptwus. (1) picked up alive at Manly, Brisbane on April 9 after "Claytons" cyclone and released at Victoria Point (SEQ) April 12 DB.
- Great-billed Heron Ardea sumatrana. Many sightings of a single bird on CSR road, Yarrabah (NEQ) from June 17 to Aug. 19, AM, DM, JC et al.
- Cattle Egret Ardeola ibis. Westerly records include a record from "Brooklyn" near Toobeah (SEQ) Jan. 1 PP, (12) birds at Dalby (SEQ) Nov. 10 PMC, TR, BF.

Black Bittern Dupetor flavicollis. Regularly noted throughout the year along Milton, Toowong and St. Lucia reaches of Brisbane River (SEQ) IV; (1) on the beach at Deception Bay (SEQ) April 12 NM; (1) at Bulli Creek c.17 km SW of Millmerran (SEQ) Jan. 19 R&JW; (1) at Biloela (SEQ) May 5 PMC; (1) at Flagstone Creek (SEQ) Sept. 26 to Oct. 20 PMC, MA, TP.

Australasian Bittern Botawus poiciloptilus. Sighted at "Cytherea" c.80 km SW of Mitchell (SCQ) April 25-26 CP,PP; (1) at "Ballanbroke" near Kingaroy June 9 (Urimbirra 18(7), p5).

Black-necked Stork Xenorhynchus asiaticus. Many records received from SEQ throughout the year including breeding records from Bald Hills and Brackenridge DAS, KM et al.

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus. Small numbers recorded throughout the year from Luggate Pt., Seven Mile Lagoon and Lytton (SEQ) by many observers.

Sacred Ibis Threshiornis aethiopica. (1) on Heron Island (SEQ) May 11 JK (a vagrant there).

- Magpie Goose Anseranas semipalmata. The influx of this species into SEQ has continued throughout 1984. (4) at Brooklyn Jan. 5 CP,PP; (1) at Bellevue, nr Chinchilla Feb. 21 H. Mason (Urimbirra 18(3), p3); (15) just N of Taroom. April 17 R. Hando (Urimbirra 18(8), p5); (14) at Eagleby Swamp, Beenleigh June KW; (10) at Old Man Lagoon, Chinchilla June 2 MW; (4) Oxenford July 1 ES; (1) at Linville Sept. GN; (12) c.20 km E of Chinchilla Sept. 22 CP,PP; (30+) at Lake Nuga Nuga in the Arcadia Valley (SEQ) Oct. 11 DA, GH et al; (44) in the Gympie area Nov. - Plumed Whistling-duck Dendrocygna eytoni. 300+ at Merinda, Bowen (NEQ) July 21 and 250+ at Pioneer (NEQ) Oct. 7, both being exceptionally high counts for these areas JW.
- Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa. A small party noted on Lake Bindigolly (SWQ) April 30 CC, TP, DAS, AS; (2) near Cooroy (SEQ) Oct. NM; c.10 birds between Ingham and Forest Beach (NEQ) Oct. 3 BD.
- Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides. About (12) at Townsville Common (NEQ) June 25 NMC. These being well N of normal range.
- Chestnut Teal Anas castanea. (2) resident throughout the year at Seven Mile Lagoon (SEQ) CC, TP, DAS et al; (1) at Lake Broadwater near Dalby (SEQ) apparently the second record here Dec. 4 MW.
- Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus. Small numbers present throughout the year in the Brisbane Valley; (55) were at Seven Mile Lagoon (SEQ) Aug. 15 ES; (8) including three young birds at Doboy, Brisbane March 24 CPY, MB, PPR; (2) at Rocklea (SEQ) Jan. 1 JT.

- Cotton Pygmy-goose Nettapus coramandelianus. At Atkinsons Dam (SEQ) throughout the year with maximum of 18 in March CC, CPY, DAS, DJ, TP, AS et al. (12) at Lowood (SEQ), March 28 DAS, PLN; (4) at Lake Clarendon (SEQ) April 22 ES; (2) birds on Rewan Station near Rolleston (SEQ) Oct. 11 DA, GH; (1) at Silverleaf Weir, Byee near Murgon (SEQ) Dec. 6 PP, DR.
- Green Pygmy-goose Nettapus pulchellus. Recorded with Cotton Pygmy-Geese just N of Taroom (SEQ) April 17. R Hando (Urimbirra 18(8), p5).
- Blue-billed Duck Oxyura australis. (1) well out of its normal range at Wynnum North (SEQ) Feb. BR; A small party noted on Lake Bindigolly (SWQ) CC, DAS.
- Musk Duck Biziwa lobata. (1) at Hoods Lagoon, near Helidon (SEQ) Feb. 19 MA; (1) on Fraser Island June 16 AW; (1) at 19 Mile Swamp, N Stradbroke I. Dec. 23 HH, GL.
- Pacific Baza Aviceda subcristata. Westerly records include (2) at Mitchell (SCQ) Sept. 4 RS, and a breeding record from Riverside, Chinchilla (SEQ) Dec. 84 IV; seen regularly in winter months in the Kenmore area (SEQ) IV; (1) 7 km N of Mitchell (SCQ) Dec. 2 DA, RS, LS.
- Square-tailed Kite Lophoictinia iswa. (1) 41 km E of Adavale March 14; (1) 70 km E of Adavale (SWQ) March 14 DJ, DAS; (1) 14 km E of Roma (SEQ) March 15 DJ, DAS; (1) at Cytherea (SCQ) April 19 PP; (1) at Mt. Molloy (NEQ) May 6 AM, DM, JC; (1) at Wondecla (NEQ) June 9 AM, DM, JC; (1) at Paluma Dam near Townsville (NEQ) June 29 CPY; (1) at Lake Clarendon (SEQ) Dec. CC, CPY, DAS.
- Black-breasted Buzzard Hamirostra melanosternon. (1) pale phase bird at Cloncurry (NWQ) Jan. 24 JW; (1) at Auburn River National Park (SEQ) April QOS camp; (1) c.16 km SW of Mitchell (SCQ) April 19 PP.
- Grey Goshawk Accipiter novaehollandiae. (1) suburban record West End, Brisbane Sept. 20 FG.
- Red Goshawk Erythrotriorchis radiatus. Single birds at The Gap Brisbane April 24, DRD; at Mt. Allen, Conondale Ranges (SEQ) Sept. GD, TP, DAS et al; and Iron Range (NEQ) Dec. 7 MC, TP.

- Little Eagle Hieraactus morphnoides. (1) at Pullenvale (SEQ)
 June 12 DA.
- Black Falcon Falco subniger. Recorded as being numerous in the Davenport Downs area (SWQ) in May PMR; (1) at Spring Hill, Brisbane June 1 TM; (1) at Atkinsons Dam (SEQ) June 3 TP; recorded at McAllister Station SW of Normanton (NWQ) in Sept. NW.
- Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus. All sightings of single birds. (1) chasing Galahs at Wooroolin Swamp (SEQ) Jan. 25 PP, DR; A juvenile at Mt. Elphinstone (SEQ) June 6 DA; (1) at Greenwood, Condamine (SEQ) Sept. 21 PP; (1) Jondah (SWQ) Sept. 24 MW; (1) Murgon (SEQ) Oct. 6 PP, DR.
- Australian Hobby Falco longipennis. Brisbane suburban records include (1) at Brisbane Airport Jan. 7 ES; (1) at Taringa July 3 DA; (1) at Archerfield May 20 ES; (1) at Hendra Oct. 13 ES; also a single bird sighted at Southport (SEQ) May 20 ES.
- Grey Falcon Falco hypoleucos. (1) bird sighted c.40 km SSE of Winton (CQ) in July SH.
- Painted Button-quail Turnix varia. Notable westerly records include (1) at Cytherea (SCQ) April 23 and July 3 PP; (1) bird 74 km S of Mitchell in mulga May 7 DA, RS, LS.
- Buff-breasted Button-quail Twinix olivei. A pair at Iron Range airstrip (NEQ) Sept. DS.
- Black-breasted Button-quail Turnix melanogaster. Regularly sighted in the Conondale Ranges and Ravensbourne NP (SEQ) throughout the year.
- Little Button-quail Turnix velox. Recorded as being very common in grasslands between Thargominda, Eulo and Adavale (SWQ) in March and April CC, TP, DAS, DJ; (1) at Malben (CQ) April 12 JW.
- Red-chested Button-quail Turnix pyrrhothorax. Recorded at Cytherea (SCQ) April 22-24 CP,PP; (1) female at Jimboomba (SEQ) Nov. 24 PB.

- Plains-wanderer Pedionomus torquatus. (6) birds including a male with two chicks on sparsely grassed reddish clay plains W of the Diamantina on Davenport Downs Station (SWQ) May 17-19 PMR.
- Buff-banded Rail Rallus philippensis. Westerly records include; (1) at "Booringa Downs" near Mitchell (SCQ) Jan. 14 DA; (1) 5 km W of Eulo (SWQ) March 11 DJ, DAS; (1) dead bird and one heard just W of Quilpie (SWQ) Sept- 22 CC.
- Lewin's Rail Rallus pectoralis. (1) dead bird 6 km E of Pomona (SEQ) Jan. 31 JP (specimen in QM). With the use of tape recorders several new localities for these elusive birds have now been located in SEQ where they are probably resident. (1) pair at Kenmore Aug. 15; (3) pairs at Pullenvale July 23; (1) pair at Dayboro Aug. 4; (1) pair at Indooropilly July 16-22 TP, CC; records were also received from the Conondale Ranges, Fig Tree Pocket, Mutdapilly and Swanbank (SEQ) dates not available CC, IV.

- Yellow-tufted Honeyeater Lichenostomus melanops. A small colony located in the Conondale Ranges (SEQ) Aug. CC; also at Wondai Forest (SEQ) Aug. 3 and Oct. 5 PP, DR.
- Grey-headed Honeyeater Lichenostomus keartlandi. A small group located 60 km E of Thargomindah (SWQ) April 30 CC, TP, DAS. Recorded breeding near Jundah (SWQ) Sept. 25 MW.
- Painted Honeyeater Grantiella picta. (1) at Mt. Walker, near Hughenden (SWQ) Sept. NW.
- White-fronted Honeyeater Phylidonyris albifrons. (5) c.40 km E of Windorah (SWQ) Sept. 28 CC, CPY, GR, AS.
- Banded Honeyeater Certhionyx pectoralis. (3) at Big Mitchell Creek, near Mt. Molloy (NEQ) Oct. 10 AMC.

- Pied Honeyeater Certhionyx variegatus. Recorded at "Lina Glen" near Mt. Stewart SW of Jundah (SWQ) Sept. R. Hando (Urimbirra 18(10), p4); (3) birds sighted c.40 km E of Windorah (SWQ) Sept. 28 CC, CPY, GR, AS.
- Yellow Chat Ephthianura crocea. Recorded as being numerous at No. 2 bore, Davenport Downs (SWQ) May 18 PMR.
- Gibberbird Ashbyia lovensis. Recorded as being numerous in the Davenport Downs area (SWQ) May 16-19 PMR.
- Painted Firetail Emblema picta. A family party sighted at "Lina Glen" (SWQ) Sept. R. Hando (Urimbirra 18(10), p4).
- Plum-headed Finch Aidemosyne modesta. Sighted at Brooklyn (SEQ) Jan. 6 PP; flocks of about 40 seen regularly from April to July at Cytherea (SCQ) PP; sighted at Georgetown (NEQ) July 17 PMC, TR, BF; c.100 about 60 km W of St. George (SCQ) March 11 DJ, DAS.
- Blue-faced Finch Erythrura trichroa. Recorded breeding at Mt. Lewis (NEQ) May 7 DM and May 17 with young F.T. Morris (The Bird Observer 635, p124). Plus many sightings throughout the year by many observers at the same locality.
- Regent Bowerbird Sericulus chrysocephalus. (7) females at Lytton (SEQ) May 6 well away from the nearest rainforest CC, TP, RD.
- Apostlebird Struthidea cinerea. (4) at Everton Hills (SEQ) March 2, this is an easterly record JB.
- Australian Magpie-lark Grallina cyanoleuca. A pair recorded as vagrant on Heron I. (SEQ) May 11 KJ; at least (2) on Herald North East Cay, about 360 km NE of Townsville (NEQ) Oct. 16 DN.
- Blackfaced Woodswallow Artamus cinereus. Recorded in numbers at the Jardine River, tip of Cape York (NEQ) Sept. 184. This is an extension in range north NW.
- Little Woodswallow Artamus minor. (6) at Dayboro (SEQ) Aug. 4 CC, TP, CPY.
- Little Crow Corvus bennetti. c.20 15-20 km W of Charleville (SWQ) March 13 DJ, DAS.

PETAL DISPLAY BY THE VARIEGATED WREN

MICHAEL STRONG AND EDITH CUFFE

On 17 September 1984 in open forest at Caboolture, southeast Queensland, 27° 04' 30", 153° 01' 15", the writer observed two male Variegated Wrens Malurus Llamberti exhibiting unusual behaviour. The birds were watched between 1230 and 1300 hrs. The day was fine and clear after heavy rain the previous night.

From a distance of some three metres a female was watched building a nest. She carried a grass stalk to a clump of Blady Grass Imperata cylindrica v major some eight metres away. Closer inspection revealed the basal structure of a nest, probably begun only that morning. As she returned with more nest material two fully plumaged adult males pursued her. Each carried a bright yellow object that close examination through fieldglasses proved to be a petal from a wallum flower Hibbertia vestita. This is a fairly common spring flower in wallum areas. A clump was flowering within two metres of the nest site.

Both males left the nest site with the female but returned with her next trip, still holding the petals. One of the males flew to the female and offered the petal in a similar fashion to feeding chicks. The female ignored him. However the male continued to carry the petal. Both males were still carrying their petals after 15 minutes of observation.

Hindwood (1951) reported similar flower-offering behaviour by a male Superb Blue Wren M. cyaneus but this seems to be the first record of such behaviour by M. lamberti. Rowley (1965) has summarised this behaviour by other members of the genus.

The obvious dark 'M' mark across this seabird's upperwings, in combination with its strikingly pale head and tail immediately limits the range of possibilities to some of the gadfly petrels of the genus Pterodroma. In fact there is only one species to which this bird shows more than the most superficial resemblance, and that is the correct one; White-headed Petrel. of course.



Mottled and Soft-plumaged Petrels may also show strong 'M' marks with pale heads and tails, but in neither case is the head anything like white, or even contrasting to any marked extent with the back. Likewise, the extreme paleness of this bird's tail is really quite diagnostic of White-headed.

Perhaps Cook's Petrel is the species which could most nearly approach the paleness of this bird, but once again, not to this extent. In the field, there should never be any problem between Cook's and White-headed as the former is a small bird, little larger than a Prion, with nearly all-white underwings whereas the latter is a big petrel with essentially all-dark underwings.
