ANOTHER QUEENSLAND LOCALITY FOR THE CARPENTARIAN GRASSWREN

The circumstances of this sighting near Mt Isa (20°43'S, 139°30'E) are remarkably similar to those reported by the late N.J. Favaloro, who was driving across the Bulloo River overflow in far south-west Queensland in September 1942, when a grasswren Amytornis sp. was flushed from beside the road. It was not until 25 years later, when he again encountered a grasswren at this site, that the Grey Grasswren A. barbatus Favaloro and McEvey was formally described.

Shortly after dawn on 30 January 1992, whilst driving along a rough road near Mt Isa, I observed a grasswren sitting on a stone on the road as I dipped into a shallow gully with a creek at the bottom. As the vehicle approached, the grasswren became startled and turned to face the vehicle. Side on, it was apparent that it may have been a Carpentarian Grasswren A. dorotheae, and when it turned to face me there was no doubt whatsoever. There were three other people in the vehicle with me, and by sheer coincidence my wife had her video camera running. For a period of 5-7 minutes we all had excellent sightings of three Carpentarian Grasswrens clearly visible as they hopped from rock to rock amongst the clumps of spinifex. At times they sat on the rocks, looking in our direction, and less than 50 m distant. On one occasion two of the birds flew up and sat side by side facing us on a black, gently sloping, fallen eucalypt. The birds stood out in stark contrast against the burnt, wet wood.

This new locality for a threatened and probably vulnerable species (Brouwer & Garnett 1990) is about 35 km farther south than recent sightings documented by Harris (1992), who described vegetation and terrain in some detail. There are some similarities when the two sites are compared. Both are dominated by Snappy Gum Eucalyptus leucophloia, with extensive ground cover (Triodia longiceps, T. pungens, Plectrachne

pungens, all spinifex species). Though undulating, the area is not dissected as are other areas in which the species is typically found (see McKean & Martin 1989). Where the creek flows across the plain, the water has cut a shallow hollow, leaving boulders strewn along its course where the soil in between has been washed away. Nevertheless, there are stones lying around amongst the spinifex. The geology is dolomitic siltstone, shale, sandstone and minor chert. There is no significant area of exposed dissected stone anywhere near the site of this discovery, the nearest being the range 8-10 km away.

Having had extensive experience with the Striated Grasswren A. striatus, I was struck by the similarity of the landform and floristic features of this locality and typical sites for that species. The principal difference in this case was that there were rocks lying around amongst the spinifex and there was a creek with exposed rocks in its bed. My wife made a video of the birds as they scampered over the rocks amongst the spinifex. Though not of high quality, it is good enough to determine that the birds are indeed Carpentarian Grasswrens, and provides a useful record and description of habitat and terrain. If it is subsequently determined that the birds occupy an area of undulating plain without any major areas of dissected escarpment, it may well be that the species will be found elsewhere in the Mt Isa region, in particular farther south and farther east.

THE QUEENSLAND ORNITHOLOGICAL SOCIETY BIRD REPORT, 1991

P.L. BRITTON

This ninth annual report lists bird records from Queensland for 1991. Data for 289 species are summarized, compared with 250 species in the 1990 report (Britton 1991). A significant increase in the number of observers contributing is also noteworthy. Data collected for the 1991 QOSI Annual Bird Count and reported on by Venables (1992) have been incorporated.




Fig. 1. Rainfall summary for 1991 (Adapted from the Monthly Weather Review – Bureau of Meteorology)

Much of the south-eastern part of the State experienced below average rainfall, while most tropical and western areas enjoyed above average rainfall (Fig. 1). The latter is perhaps deceptive, in terms of the extraordinary contribution associated with the aftermath of Cyclone Joy at the beginning of the year, which was followed by a very dry period.

There are no Queensland records for four species detailed here, including Namaqua Dove and Red-whiskered Bulbul, occurring as escapees or likely escapees. Proper documentation is lacking for sight records of Cox's Sandpiper at Karumba and Grey Heron near Proserpine, though both have appeared in print. Garnett (1992) referred to a confirmed but undated record of Alexandra's Parrot breeding near Cloncurry, and there are further sightings from Windorah detailed in this report. These Windorah records likewise lack proper documentation. Cox's Sandpiper and various other Holarctic waders are notoriously difficult to identify, and unsubstantiated sightings of various of these at Cairns and elsewhere have prompted pleas for published documentation (see Britton 1991). A similar lack of supporting data was a feature of extra-limital Papuan species in 1988 (Britton 1990).

Garnett (1992) describes the status of the southern form coxeni of Double-eyed Fig-Parrot as both vulnerable and critical. A Mudgeeraba record involving six birds is of considerable interest, while a bird inside a house at Norman Park is unprecedented. The individual involved in the latter case must have been a wild bird since none is thought to exist in captivity (D.J. Spittall, pers. comm.).

METHODS

Records included have been selected by the compiler. Omission from this report in no way implies that a record was considered erroneous. Format, nomenclature, abbreviations and sources for published records are as used in the 1986 Bird Report (Redhead 1988). The regional location (Fig. 2) is given in parenthesis for less well-known localities the first time each appears. Initials of the observers appear after other details of each record.

This distinctive species ranges widely in Asia, south-east to the Philippines, Borneo and Java, but hardly crosses Wallace's Line (White & Bruce 1986). It is to be hoped that this exceptional record will be fully documented in a future issue of Sunbird so that it does not attract the description "never substantiated" along with earlier Queensland records.

A SECOND QUEENSLAND RINGED PLOVER AT YEPPOON

As a Palaearctic vagrant, the Ringed Plover Charadrius hiaticula is virtually annual in Australia in recent years (Lane 1987). There are two Queensland records: Boonooroo from 17 July to 23 August 1983 (Stewart 1984); and Kinka Beach, Yeppoon on 20 February 1987 (Redhead 1990). The second of these Queensland records is documented in this note. This species and the possibly conspecific Semipalmated Plover C. semipalmatus from North America are very similar. The latter is not considered in the following discussion.

This distinctive species is readily identified if features are noted to distinguish it from the Little Ringed Plover C. dubius. This is especially true for birds in adult plumage as this bird was. Using 8x40 binoculars the Yeppoon bird was seen twice in the same morning, at ranges down to 10-20 m for a total of about 20 minutes. Orange legs, a pronounced black breast band, and a prominent white collar, very pronounced when the bird was seen from behind, were distinctive. This small, plump plover was rather wary of the somewhat smaller Red-capped Plovers C. ruficapillus which fed nearby. It was watched on an open, sandy shore, following the margin of a 'run-in' of water left by the retreating tide. The bird exhibited a rather characteristic run-stop gait. Brownish upperparts contrasted with pure white underparts, and the short, thickish bill was noticeably black at the tip with a significantly paler base. The distinctive large eye lacked the eyering of Little Ringed Plover, though there appeared to be some white around the eye.

The Sunbird is published quarterly by the Queensland Ornithological Society to further the knowledge of birds in Queensland and adjacent northern regions of Australia.

Papers are invited from non-members as well as members on all aspects of ornithology, e.g. life history, taxonomy, distribution, behaviour, and ecology. Articles may take the form of major articles on specific birds, birds in specific areas or habitats, or short notes on either birds themselves or the literature on birds, such as reviews of books or comments on published articles.

Submission of a paper implies that the results reported have not been published and are not being considered for publication elsewhere. The editor reserves the right to submit records of rare birds to the Records Appraisal Committee of the Royal Australasian Ornithologists Union.

Manuscripts can be supplied on floppy disk (IBM or MACINTOSH systems using plain text 'ASCII format') or in typed form on paper. When typed, the manuscript should be double-spaced and two copies sent. Papers longer than four typed A4 pages should have a summary. If needed, help may be given to authors to find relevant literature. Common names, scientific names and order of names should follow 'Recommended English Names for Australian Birds', in *The Emu* Volume 77, Supplement, 1978. Intending authors should consult recent issues of *The Sunbird* to see acceptable forms of contributions.
