

Birdwatching in Brisbane

South-east Queensland is one of Australia's biodiversity hotspots. At the time of printing, 395 of Australia's bird species have been recorded in Brisbane (>40% of the Australian total species). This diversity is due to the subtropical location and wide variety of habitats including beaches, wetlands, grasslands, woodland, mangroves, rainforest and large freshwater dams and lakes.



TIP: Many birds are more active and vocal in the first few hours after sunrise. This can be a good time to go birding.



TIP: It is useful to get to know the calls of birds, particularly the common species. There are phone apps available with bird calls which may be of assistance. Approach birds quietly, watching their behaviour. Do not approach nests as nesting birds may permanently leave their nests if disturbed.



TIP: Shorebird roosts are best visited at high tide when the birds are unable to feed. At low tide, shorebirds spread out to feed on mud flats and can be difficult to identify. Many of our shorebirds are only present during summer.



SHARE: Please upload your sighting lists to an online database (<https://ebird.org/australia/home> or <https://birddata.birdlife.org.au/home>) to help with conservation and management of Australia's native birds.



RESOURCES: Use binoculars and have a field guide or phone app available (some apps include bird calls and/or photographs). A telescope is useful for shorebirds and at large water bodies. For general birdwatching tips and resources see www.birdsqueensland.org.au



SAFETY: Brisbane has a subtropical climate. Sun protection is essential while bird watching at any time of the year. Wear protective clothing including a hat and suitable footwear and carry sunscreen, insect repellent and water at all times. Be aware of the terrain and be mindful of other creatures which share it.

Descriptions provide location addresses, UBD reference numbers if available, GPS coordinates and a list of interesting species that occur at the site depending on the time of the year. Species lists were compiled using data from eBird <https://ebird.org/australia/home> and with input from local birders. Migratory species are marked with an * and can be seen on a seasonal basis (some are summer visitors and others are winter visitors so check your field guide). Other birds (e.g. some honeyeaters) are nomadic although can be seen in small numbers most of the year. Bird names used here generally follow the latest IOC recommendations and may differ from some field guides.

Common Brisbane Birds

These birds are often observed (in suitable habitats) at most sites in the Brisbane area and are not included in individual site descriptions:

Maned (Australian Wood) Duck, Pacific Black Duck, Australian Brushturkey, Australian White Ibis, Masked Lapwing, Rock Dove (Feral Pigeon), Spotted Dove, Crested Pigeon, Laughing Kookaburra, Galah, Sulphur-crested Cockatoo, Rainbow Lorikeet, Brown Honeyeater, Blue-faced Honeyeater, Noisy Miner, Grey Butcherbird, Pied Butcherbird, Australian Magpie, Pied Currawong, Australasian Figbird, Willie Wagtail, Magpie-lark, Torresian Crow, Welcome Swallow, Common Myna.

1 City Botanic Gardens

The inner-city gardens are accessible from several points. Paved paths, playgrounds, cafes, parkland, gardens, mangroves. *Hardhead, Buff-banded Rail, Dusky Moorhen, Australasian Swamphen, Bush Stone-curlew, Scaly-breasted Lorikeet, Tree Martin.*

★ 2 Kedron Brook Wetlands

Flat paved track along canal shared with cyclists. Playground. Saltmarsh, grassland, mangroves, wetland. Take insect repellent. *Black Swan, Chestnut Teal, Royal Spoonbill, Great Egret, White-faced Heron, Whistling and Black-shouldered Kite, Swamp Harrier, Pied Stilt, Red-necked Avocet, Black-fronted Dotterel, Sharp-tailed Sandpiper*, Eastern Grass Owl, Mangrove Honeyeater, Mangrove Gerygone, Tawny Grassbird, Golden-headed Cisticola, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin, Australian Pipit.*

3 Boondall Wetlands



Paperbark Drive, Boondall 4034 | UBD 111 C14 GPS -27.3405, 153.0786

Paved and unpaved tracks. Bird hide, visitor centre. See BCC Boondall Wetlands track map and Birds of Boondall brochure available at the Visitor Centre. Mangroves, saltmarsh, freshwater wetland, woodland, grassland. Take insect repellent. *Shining Bronze Cuckoo, Tawny Frogmouth, Sacred, Forest and Torresian Kingfisher, Superb, Variegated and Red-backed Fairywren, Scarlet Myzomela (Honeyeater).*

4 Nudgee Beach & Tabbil-ban dhagun Boardwalk



O'Quinn Street, Nudgee Beach 4014 | UBD 111 M15 GPS -27.3430, 153.0995

Formed unpaved tracks and boardwalk through the mangroves. Bird hide, playground. See BCC Boondall Wetlands track map. Mudflats, mangroves, saltmarsh. Take insect repellent. *Striated Heron, White-faced Heron, Osprey, Brahminy Kite, Pacific Golden Plover*, Bar-tailed Godwit*, Eurasian Whimbrel*, Far Eastern Curlew*, Australian Tern, Torresian Kingfisher, Rainbow Bee-eater, Mangrove Honeyeater, Mangrove Gerygone.*

★ 5 Dowse Lagoon



Second Lagoon Reserve, Brighton Street, Sandgate 4017

Paved walking track. Bird hide, viewing platforms. Grassland, open woodland, lake. *Maggie Goose, Wandering Whistling Duck, Cotton Pygmy Goose, Grey Teal, Hardhead, Australasian Grebe, Glossy Ibis, Intermediate Egret, Little Black and Great Cormorant, Eurasian Coot, Latham's Snipe*, Whiskered Tern, Little Corella, Superb Fairywren.*

Paved and unpaved formed tracks, boardwalk, bird hide, boat ramp. See BCC Tinchy Tamba track map. River estuary, mangroves, saltmarsh, mud flats, woodland. Take insect repellent. *Chestnut Teal, Straw-necked Ibis, Striated Heron, White-faced Heron, Whistling Kite, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Red-capped Plover, Far Eastern Curlew*, Marsh Sandpiper*, Caspian Tern, Bar-shouldered Dove, Shining Bronze Cuckoo, Brush Cuckoo*, Oriental Dollarbird*, Rainbow Bee-eater, Pale-headed Rosella, Variegated, Superb and Red-backed Fairywren, Yellow-faced Honeyeater, Mangrove Honeyeater, Mangrove Gerygone, White-breasted Woodswallow, Rufous Shrikethrush, Rufous and Grey Fantail, Australian Reed Warbler.*

8 Canterbury Park & Barungwarra Bushland Reserve

Paved tracks. Grassland, parkland, wetlands, lake, mangroves. Adjacent to South Pine River. *Black Swan, Great and Intermediate Egret, Brahminy Kite, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Rainbow Bee-eater, Little Corella, Pale-headed Rosella.*

9 Raven Street Reserve



Downfall Creek Bushland Centre, 815 Rode Road, Chermide West 4032

UBD 119 F16 GPS -27.3896, 153.0048

Paved and unpaved formed tracks, some hilly. See BCC Chermide Hills Reserves track map. Visitor centre, playground, woodland, riparian vegetation. *Australian Boobook, Rainbow Bee-eater, Scaly-breasted Lorikeet, Scarlet Myzomela (Honeyeater), Noisy Friarbird, White-throated Honeyeater, Striated Pardalote, Australian Golden Whistler, Olive-backed Oriole, Spangled Drongo, Grey Fantail, Eastern Yellow Robin.*

10 Downfall Creek (Marchant Park & 7th Brigade Park)



Murphy Road, Chermide 4032 | UBD 120 A10 GPS -27.3782, 153.0338

Paved and unpaved formed tracks. Large playground. Parkland, woodland, riparian vegetation. Best on southern side of creek. *Bush Stone-curlew, Variegated Fairywren, Little Corella, Scaly-breasted Lorikeet, Striated Pardalote, Rufous Whistler.*

11 Banks Street Reserve



Creek Avenue, Ashgrove 4060 | UBD 139 B17 GPS -27.4372, 152.9964

Paved, unpaved formed and unformed tracks. Woodland, remnant rainforest, riparian vegetation along Enoggera Creek. Most productive is southern section along the creek and surrounds including revegetation area. *Royal Spoonbill, Brown Goshawk, Lewin's Rail, Pale-vented Bush-hen, Rose-crowned Fruit Dove, Oriental Dollarbird*, Variegated Fairywren, Olive-backed Oriole, Spectacled Monarch.*

12 Ross Road Parklands



Ross Road, Upper Kedron, 4055 | UBD 137 A10 GPS -27.42055, 152.9101

Access at end of Ross Road. Unformed tracks and mowed paths. Three dams. Extensive replanting of native vegetation. *Brown Quail, Brown Goshawk, Lewin's Rail, Pale-vented Bush-hen, Brown Cuckoo-Dove, Topknot Pigeon, Pheasant Coucal, Azure Kingfisher, Restless Flycatcher.*

West

13 Mt Coot-tha Botanic Gardens



Mt Coot-tha Road, Toowong, 4066 | UBD 158 L13 GPS -27.4759, 152.9775

Paved paths. Café, Information Centre, herbarium, library, planetarium. Map available at Information Centre. Landscaped gardens and lakes. *Hardhead, Australasian Grebe, Little Black and Little Pied Cormorant, Bush Stone-curlew, Scaly-breasted Lorikeet.*

Mt Coot-tha Reserve (Mt Coot-tha Forest) – Sites 14-16 are similar in habitat and species. See Brisbane City Council (BCC) Mt Coot-tha Forest track map on the BCC website.

14 J C Slaughter Falls



Sir Samuel Griffith Drive, Mt Coot-tha, 4066

Unpaved formed and unformed tracks. Parkland, woodland, riparian vegetation. *Powerful Owl, Pale-headed Rosella, Australian King Parrot, White-throated Treecreeper, White-throated Honeyeater, White-browed and Large-billed Scrubwren, Brown Thornbill, Eastern Whipbird, Spangled Drongo, Leaden Flycatcher.*

15 Simpson Falls



Sir Samuel Griffith Dve, Mt Coot-tha, 4066 | UBD 158 F9 GPS -27.4660, 152.9649

Unpaved formed and unformed tracks. Woodland, riparian vegetation. *Australian King Parrot, Scaly-breasted Lorikeet, Yellow-faced Honeyeater, Lewin's Honeyeater, Spotted Pardalote*, Eastern Whipbird, Grey Fantail.*

16 Gap Creek Reserve



Gap Creek Road, Mt Coot-tha, 4066 | UBD 157 H15 GPS -27.4787, 152.9283

Unformed tracks, shared with off-road cyclists. Woodland, riparian vegetation. *Channel-billed Cuckoo*, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, White-throated Treecreeper, Noisy Friarbird, Scarlet Myzomela (Honeyeater), Brown Thornbill, Eastern Whipbird, Common Cicadabird, Rufous and Australian Golden Whistler, Grey Shrikethrush.*

Facilities only at the Discovery Centre. Unpaved formed and unformed tracks. Discovery Centre, café, small zoo. Woodland, lake, rainforest. *Hardhead, Australasian Grebe, Painted Buttonquail, Bush Stone-curlew, Comb-crested Jacana, Peaceful Dove, Pacific Koel*, Shining Bronze Cuckoo, Forest Kingfisher, Variegated Fairywren, Little Lorikeet, White-naped Honeyeater, Bell Miner, White-browed Scrubwren, Eastern Whipbird, Common Cicadabird, Varied Triller, Rose Robin*, Red-browed Finch.*

18 Bellbird Grove



Off Mt Nebo Rd, Enoggera Reservoir, 4520 | UBD 136 P7 GPS -27.43145, 152.8972

Heading to Mt Nebo, entrance is on the right approximately 4km from Walkabout Creek. Unformed tracks. Mountain bikes allowed on some shared trails – see Department of Environment and Science website. Woodland, riparian vegetation. *Little Bronze Cuckoo, White-throated Gerygone, Brown and Buff-rumped Thornbill, Spotted Quail-thrush on ridges, Spectacled Monarch, Rose Robin*.*

19 Jolly's Lookout



Mt Nebo Road, Jolly's Lookout 4520 | UBD 135 M1 GP -27.4000, 152.8070

Entrance is on the left-hand side approximately 16km from Walkabout Creek. There are two tracks – shorter Egernia Circuit and longer Thylogale Track. Birds can also be seen in the picnic area. Formed unpaved tracks, some steps. Woodland, rainforest. *White-throated Treecreeper, Bell Miner, Large-billed Scrubwren, Brown Gerygone, Brown Thornbill, Australian Golden Whistler, Rufous and Grey Fantail, Black-faced and Spectacled Monarchs.*

20 Boombana



Mt Nebo Road, Mt Nebo 4520 | UBD 135 J1 GPS -27.4018, 152.7926

Entrance is on the left-hand side approximately 17km from Walkabout Creek. Formed unpaved track (Pitta Circuit) with boardwalk around large fig. No steps on circuit. Rainforest and wet sclerophyll forest. *Brown Cuckoo-Dove, Wompoo Fruit Dove, Crimson Rosella, Green Catbird, Scarlet Myzomela (Honeyeater), Yellow-faced Honeyeater, Lewin's Honeyeater, Spotted Pardalote, Yellow-throated and Large-billed Scrubwren, Brown Gerygone, Brown Thornbill, Australian Golden Whistler, Grey Fantail, Eastern Yellow Robin.*

★ 21 D'Aguilar National Park - Maiala



Mt Glorious Road, Mt Glorious, 4520

Formed unpaved track, some steps. Rainforest. *Brown Cuckoo-Dove, Topknot, Wonga and White-headed Pigeon, Wompoo and Rose-crowned Fruit Dove, Australian King Parrot, Crimson Rosella, Noisy Pitta, Green Catbird, Regent and Satin Bowerbird, Eastern Spinebill, Lewin's Honeyeater, Yellow-throated and Large-billed Scrubwren, Brown Gerygone, Australian Logrunner, Eastern Whipbird, Australian Golden Whistler, Rufous Fantail, Black-faced Monarch, Paradise Riflebird, Pale-yellow and Rose Robin, Russet-tailed Thrush.*

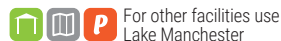

Unformed tracks and fire trails. Grassland, riparian vegetation, lake, dry woodland. Mountain Biking at Blue Gum Flats. *Black Swan, Hardhead, Great-crested Grebe, White-faced Heron, Pacific Baza, Whistling Kite, Comb-crested Jacana, Brown Cuckoo-Dove, Common Bronzewing, Wonga Pigeon, Pheasant Coucal, Channel-billed Cuckoo*, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Oriental Dollarbird*, Forest Kingfisher, Little Lorikeet, Pale-headed Rosella, White-throated Treecreeper, Black-chinned Honeyeater, Fuscous Honeyeater, Weebill, White-throated Gerygone, Buff-rumped Thornbill, Dusky Woodswallow*, Varied Triller, Varied Sittella, Australian Golden and Rufous Whistler, Rufous and Grey Shrikethrush, Leaden and Restless Flycatcher, Rose Robin*, Eastern Yellow Robin, Silveryeye, Red-browed Finch.*

30 Biami Yumba Park (Fig Tree Pocket)



Ormsby Street, Fig Tree Pocket (access to riverside parkland via Bottecelli Street), 4069 | UBD 198 G2 GPS -27.5386, 152.9675

Facilities are in Biami Yumba Park. The park has a lake and open parkland. The riverbank park is accessed off Botticelli Street adjacent to equestrian centre and has mangroves, riparian vegetation, woodland. Unformed tracks. *Hardhead, Intermediate Egret, Little Black and Little Pied Cormorant, Australasian Darter, Little Corella, Pale-headed Rosella.*

31 Mt Ommaney Bushland Reserve

Unpaved formed tracks, boardwalk, some hills. *Pacific Baza, Rose-crowned Fruit Dove, Australian King Parrot, Spangled Drongo, Rufous Fantail, Spectacled and Black-faced Monarch, Eastern Yellow Robin.*

32 Sherwood Arboretum



Jolimont Street, Sherwood 4075

UBD 178 K19 GPS -27.5327, 152.9744

Some paved tracks. Parkland, lakes, riverbank. *Maggie Goose, Intermediate Egret, Little Pied Cormorant, Pale-vented Bush-hen, White-headed Pigeon, Australian King Parrot, Little Friarbird, Australian Reed Warbler.*

38 Whites Hill Reserve



Boundary Road, Camp Hill, 4152

UBD 181 B8 GPS -27.5091, 153.0773

Walk the bushland east and south of the football fields. Unpaved formed and unformed tracks, hilly. Woodland, dry rainforest, parkland, small water area south of football field. *Brown Goshawk, Pheasant Coucal, Sacred Kingfisher, Rainbow Bee-eater, Pale-headed Rosella, Noisy Friarbird, Rufous Whistler, Black-faced Cuckooshrike, Olive-backed Oriole, Leaden Flycatcher, Double-barred Finch.*

Paved and unpaved unformed tracks. Boat ramp. Wetland, lagoon, woodland, grassland, mangroves, parkland. *Maggie Goose, Wandering Whistling Duck, Comb-crested Jacana, Latham's Snipe*, Bar-shouldered Dove, Pacific Koel*, Channel-billed Cuckoo*, Oriental Dollarbird*, Grey Shrikethrush, Golden-headed Cisticola.*

40 Metroplex Avenue Wetlands

Paved tracks and jetty/pontoon on Brisbane River. 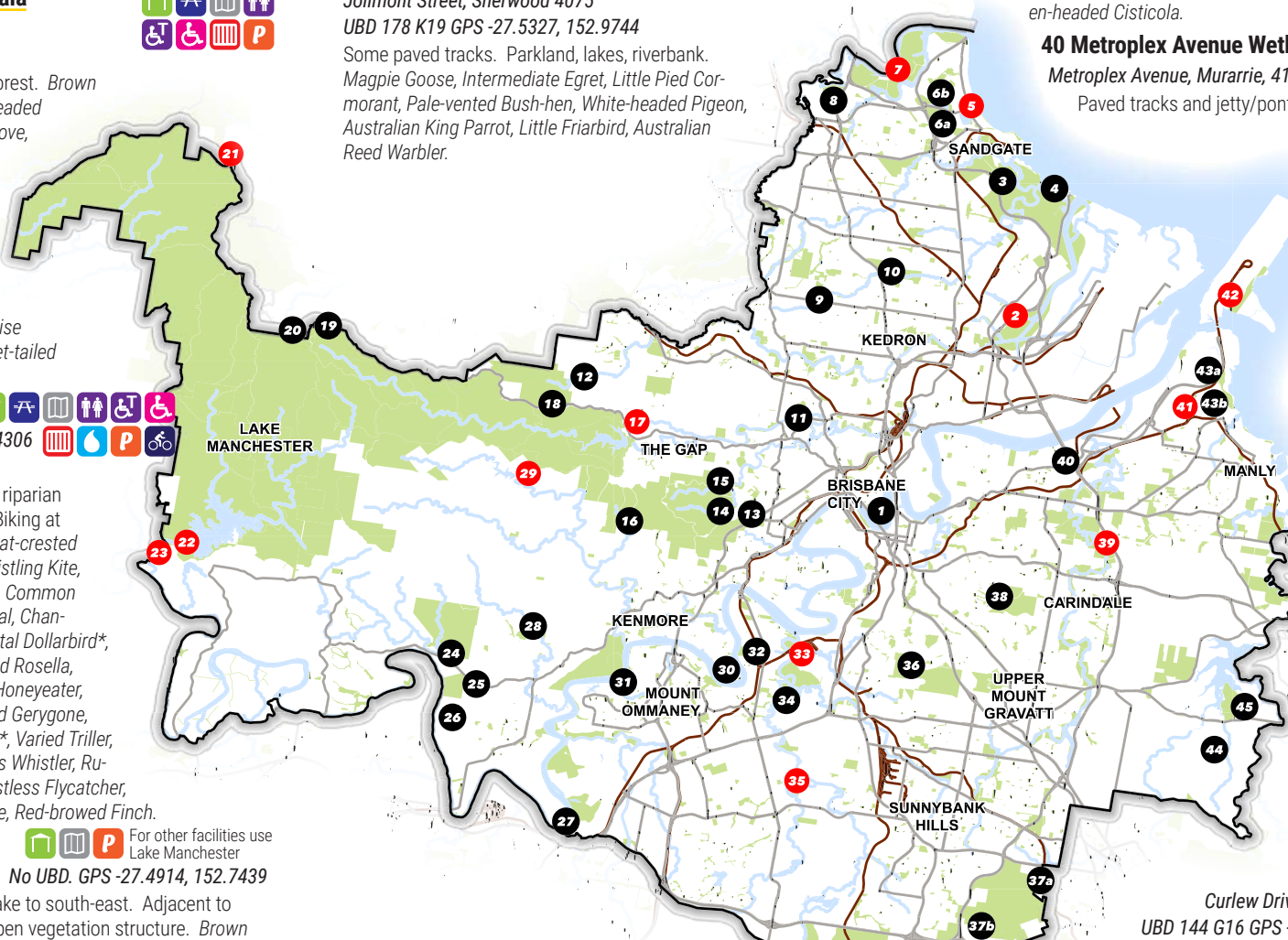

26 Anstead Bushland Reserve South (SES Reserve)

Track is 4km one way so it can be helpful if more than one birder attends to have a car parked at both the south (Bowhill Road) and northern end of the track.
