

Creek, lagoons and creek. Combined or separate walks possible.

(a) Walk on mown grass at edge of Jane Gorry Park and creek, north of Benezet Dr, and Goodna Pony Club park, to view birds in wide strip of remnant forest on east side of Woogaroo Creek. **(b)** Brittain Rd, Augustine Heights. Take concrete path across creek to view bushland and lagoons on western side of creek. Follow concrete footpath from end of Brittain Rd, along Carde-na Drive, Cornelius Drive to Romulus Cct.

37. Opossum Creek Parklands

58 Scoparia Drive, Brookwater UBD 236 N 14-15. -27.6578, 152.9007

Mixed eucalypt forest with views of wetland at nearby golf course. Level concrete wheelchair accessible path, mostly flat. Explore park and mature forest along creek for 1500 m to Lomandra Court. *Brown Cuckoo-Dove, Bar-shouldered Dove, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Dusky Moorhen, Sacred Kingfisher*, Australian King Parrot, Pale-headed Rosella, White-throated Treecreeper, Variegated Fairywren, Scarlet Honeyeater*, White-throated & Yellow-faced* Honeyeaters, Spotted Pardalote*, White-browed Scrubwren, Eastern Whipbird, Common Cicadabird*, Australian Golden Whistler*, Olive-backed Oriole, Spangled Drongo*, Rufous Fantail*, Leaden Flycatcher*, Eastern Yellow & Rose* Robins, Red-browed Finch.*

38. Discovery Lake & Creekside Track, Opossum Creek

180 Springfield Lakes Boulevard, Springfield Lakes UBD 257 C3. - 27.6757, 152.9159

Urban park with remnant eucalyptus forest, creekside walk and large constructed lake. **(a) Discovery Lake:** follow sealed paths around western edge of lake, main access from picnic area at 180 Springfield Lakes Blvd, Springfield Lakes. -27.6757, 152.9159 **(b) Creekside Track:** enter public track beside 14 Springfield Lakes Blvd, to walk through bushland along Opossum Creek. Note separate eBird hotspots, species lists for these sites.

Cotton Pygmy Goose, Hardhead, Eurasian Coot, Australasian Grebe, Little Pied Cormorant, Comb-crested Jacana, Royal Spoonbill, Black-shouldered Kite, Sa-cred & Azure Kingfishers, Pale-headed Rosella, Variegated Fairywren, Eastern Spinebill*, Blue-faced Honeyeater, Australian Golden Whistler*, Olive-backed Oriole, Rose Robin*, Fairy Martin, Red-browed & Double-barred Finches.*

39. Spring Lake & Lakeside Ave Park

Montello Circuit (opp. nos 1-11) UBD D18, or 55 Burlington Terrace UBD E19, Springfield Lakes. -27.667220, 152.918610.

Constructed lake that attracts waterbirds, mixed vegetation around edges including open forest, riparian (creekside) habitat and parkland. Flat walk on accessible, sealed tracks around lake; optional walks on mown grass in Lakeside Avenue Park (separate eBird hotspot) which adjoins Spring Lake on southern side. *Cotton Pygmy Goose, Pacific Black Duck, Hardhead, Dusky Moorhen, Eurasian Coot, Australasian Swamphen, Australasian Grebe, Comb-crested Jacana, Australasian Darter, Little Black & Little Pied Cormo-rants, Great Cormorant, Great & Plumed Egrets, Blue-faced Honeyeater, Little Friarbird, Olive-backed Oriole, Fairy Martin.*

Site Notes

Species lists provide examples of species that occur at the particular site, though some are seen more frequently than others. Both very common Ipswich birds and also only very occasionally occurring species have been excluded from the site lists. Seasonally migratory species are marked with a single asterisk*. The lists were compiled using data from eBird.org and input from local birders. They follow the IOC taxonomy.

Common Birds of Ipswich

Birding in Ipswich

Almost 300 bird species Ipswich (approximately 47% of Queensland's avifauna) have been identified in the Ipswich local government area (LGA). Ipswich City Council's Birds of Ipswich booklet, available in Council libraries and the Queens Park Environmental Centre, provides a full list of birds recorded in the LGA.

Bird species vary among Ipswich's wide range of natural habitats—including vine scrub, dry eucalyptus forest, remnant brigalow patches, riverine, wetland, grassland. Some sites in this brochure have a predominant habitat type, while some have mixed habitat but the mix varies.

Northern And Western Sites

1. Riverside Park

Park Rd, Karalee UBD 195 H-J3. -27.5411, 152.851

A park on the upper Brisbane River with balance between open parkland and natural areas, with good range of easily accessible birdlife. Habitats include riparian vegetation, a tidal gully, eucalyptus forest and open parkland. Paved and unsealed formed trails, mown grass areas. *Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Straw-necked Ibis, Striated Heron, Australasian Darter, Grey Goshawk, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Forest Kingfisher, Australian King Parrot, Little Lorikeet, Variegated Fairywren, Scarlet Honeyeater*, White-browed Scrubwren, Eastern Whipbird, Varied Triller, Australian Golden Whistler*, Grey Shrikethrush, Rufous Fantail*, Spangled Drongo*, Eastern Yellow Robin, Tawny Grassbird, Golden-headed Cisticola, Mistletoebird, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

2. Katherine Court Reserve

Katherine Court, Karalee UBD 194 Q9. -27.5544, 152.8246

Riverside park with extensive natural areas, including grassland, riparian vegetation, scattered woodland and two lagoons. Walk down the bitumen road beyond the vehicle barrier, to explore the park in several directions via unsealed tracks. *Brown Quail, Pheasant Coucal, Peaceful Dove, Straw-necked Ibis, Plumed Egret, Australasian Darter, Brahminy Kite, Oriental Dollarbird*, Sacred Kingfisher*, Striped Honeyeater, Eastern Whipbird, Olive-backed Oriole, Spangled Drongo*, Grey Fantail*, Tawny Grassbird, Golden-headed Cisticola, Red-browed Finch, Double-barred Finch, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

3. Colleges Crossing Recreation Reserve

408-492 Mt Crosby Rd, Chuwar UBD 194 F10. -27.5574, 152.7981

Popular recreational reserve and picnic spot on Brisbane River. Habitats include the Brisbane River and lagoon, riparian vegetation with grassland, parkland with scattered mature eucalypts. Undulating mix of sealed and mown grass walking routes from several parking areas. **Advisable to check Council website before visiting as the reserve is subject to closures after significant floods**. *Hardhead, Channel-billed Cuckoo*, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Eurasian Coot, Black-fronted Dotterel, Caspian Tern, Great Cormorant, Australasian Darter, Striated Heron, Great & Plumed Egrets, Australian Pelican, Osprey, Whistling Kite, Brahminy Kite, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Oriental Dollarbird*, Little Lorikeet, Eastern Whipbird, White-breasted Woodswallow, Tawny Grassbird, Golden-headed Cisticola, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

4. Kholo Bridge Reserve

59-77 Powers Rd, Muirlea UBD 193 A15. -27.5689, 152.748

A small riverside reserve between Powers and Kholo Rds, with good range of birds. Habitats include dry eucalyptus forest, grassy areas and a vine scrub gully, as well as riverine vegetation and views of waterbirds along river. Slashed grass trails. An unformed track across southern section of gully leads to Kholo Rd side. *Common Bronzewing, Wonga Pigeon, Peaceful Dove, Pheasant Coucal, Channel-billed Cuckoo*, Shining Bronze Cuckoo, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Australasian Darter, Whistling Kite, Oriental Dollarbird*, Pale-headed Rosella, Little Lorikeet, Scarlet* & Yellow-faced* Honeyeaters, Spotted Pardalote*, White-browed Scrubwren, White-throated Gerygone, Eastern Whipbird, Rufous Whistler, Grey Shrikethrush, Leaden Flycatcher*, Rose* & Eastern Yellow Robins, Tawny Grassbird.*

5. Kholo Gardens

243 Riverside Drive, Muirlea UBD 192 N14. -27.5652, 152.7392

A popular riverside picnic reserve with a mixture of open parklands, forest,

wetlands and riparian birding. Paved and unpaved formed tracks, level to sloping in upper area, remainder hilly, some steep. *Pacific Black Duck, Brown Cuckoo-Dove, Wonga Pigeon, Bar-shouldered Dove, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Australasian Darter, Great Egret, Whistling Kite, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Forest Kingfisher, Australian King Parrot, Little Lorikeet, Scarlet* & Striped Honeyeaters, Blue-faced & Lewin's Honeyeaters, White-browed Scrubwren, Eastern Whipbird, Varied Triller, Rufous Shrikethrush, Grey* & Rufous* Fantails, Eastern Yellow Robin, Mistletoebird, Red-browed Finch.*

6. Kholo Road Park (aka Powers Rd reserve)

Reservoir Lane, Muirlea UBD 193 B17. -27.57347, 152.75278

Dry eucalyptus bushland with understorey; more densely, moistly vegetated gully through one side. Unsealed tracks, uneven and rough in parts (base level mountain biking), undulating to steep in short sections. *Common Bronzewing, Pacific Baza, Pale-headed Rosella, Little Lorikeet, White-throated Treecreeper, Variegated Fairywren, Scarlet Honeyeater*, Spotted Pardalote*, Speckled Warbler, White-browed Scrubwren, Eastern Whipbird, White-bellied Cuckooshrike, Common Cicadabird*, Spangled Drongo, Leaden Flycatcher*, Mistletoebird.*

7. Riverside Drive, Pine Mountain

Opposite 801 Riverside Dr, Pine Mountain UBD 172 Q15. -27.5224, 152.744

Road walk with limited traffic, with remnant vine scrub on verges, some open forest and farmland. Graded gravel road, walk both directions from starting place. *Brown Cuckoo-Dove, Pacific Emerald Dove, Wonga Pigeon, Rose-crowned Fruit Dove*, Black-breasted Buttonquail (elusive), Collared Sparrowhawk, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Australian Boobook, Oriental Dollarbird*, Australian King Parrot, Scarlet Honeyeater*, Spotted Pardalote*, Speckled Warbler, Large-billed Scrubwren, Varied Triller, Australian Golden Whistler*, Rufous Shrikethrush, Rufous Fantail*, Spectacled Monarch*, White-eared Monarch, Rose Robin*.*

8. Mihi Junction Reserve

13 B Haig St, Brassall UBD 213 B7. -27.595, 152.7518

Bushland reserve at creek and river junction. Riparian vegetation along with extensive grassland, open areas and some eucalypts. View birds from wide central concrete paths, from dirt tracks through bushland, and side excursions on mown grass. Alternative access from corner Musgrave St and WM Hughes St, North Ipswich (UBD 213 D7, -27.5948, 152.7563). *Brown Quail, Australasian Darter, Great Egret, Brown Goshawk, Brahminy Kite, Sacred Kingfisher*, Little Lorikeet, White-throated Honeyeater, White-browed Scrubwren, White-throated Gerygone, Eastern Whipbird, Rufous Whistler, Leaden Flycatcher*, Eastern Yellow Robin, Tawny Grassbird, Mistletoebird, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

9. Walter Zimmerman Park

6 Kirkston Place, Pine Mountain UBD 192 A14. -27.5674, 152.7098

Mixture of open forest and woodlands, parkland and grassland areas. Unsealed, formed tracks on circular walk, incorporating the trails in the park and along the adjacent section of the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail. *Australian Brush-turkey, Common Bronzewing, Peaceful Dove, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Square-tailed Kite, Pacific Baza, Australian Boobook, Oriental Dollarbird*, Sacred Kingfisher*, Australian King Parrot, Variegated Fairywren, Scarlet* & White-throated Honeyeaters, Yellow-faced Honeyeater*, Spotted Pardalote*, Speckled Warbler, White-browed Scrubwren, White-throated Gerygone, Eastern Whipbird, Rufous Whistler, Grey Shrikethrush, Eastern Yellow Robin, Red-browed Finch.*

10. Brisbane Valley Rail Trail—Desbrow St to Walter Zimmerman Park

Pine Mountain Quarry Rd near Desbrow St, Pine Mountain UBD 191 Q-R11. -27.5585, 152.7050

A section of the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail comprising eucalyptus forest habitat. Access off Pine Mountain Quarry Road near Desbrow St corner. Walk 650 metres south toward Walter Zimmerman Park to the point where a gully crosses the track through a culvert. Unsealed track. *Bar-shouldered Dove, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Brown Goshawk, Oriental Dollarbird*, Pale-headed Rosella, Little Lorikeet, Scarlet Honeyeater*, White-throated & Yellow-faced* Honeyeaters, Speckled Warbler, White-browed Scrubwren, Eastern Whipbird, Rufous Whistler, Olive-backed Oriole, Grey* & Rufous* Fantails, Leaden Flycatcher*, Eastern Yellow Robin, Silvereye, Double-barred & Red-browed Finches.*

11. Pine Mountain Bush Reserve

20-100 Pine Mountain Quarry Rd, Pine Mountain UBD 191 Q5. -27.5442, 152.7096

Open forest with understorey, and small dams. Unsealed circular track with moderate inclines. *Peaceful Dove, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Australian King Parrot, Little Lorikeet, Variegated Fairywren, Scarlet* & Striped Honeyeaters, Little Friarbird, White-throated & Fuscous Honeyeaters, Spotted Pardalote*, Speckled Warbler, White-browed Scrubwren, White-throated Gerygone, Eastern Whipbird, Rufous Whistler, Grey Shrikethrush, Olive-backed Oriole, Spangled Drongo*, Rufous Fantail*, Leaden Flycatcher*, Rose Robin*.*

12. Brisbane Valley Rail Trail—Pine Mountain

149-165 Pine Mountain Quarry Road, Pine Mountain. UBD 191 Q8. -27.552701, 152.702754

Walk Rail Trail from Pine Mountain Quarry Rd to James Road. Mixed forest with lower storey, patches of dense understorey; farm dams in vicinity of Pine Mountain Quarry Rd entry. Flat, unsealed, formed, wide accessible track. *Peaceful & Bar-shouldered Doves, Australasian Swamphen, Sacred Kingfisher*, Variegated Fairywren, Scarlet* & Yellow-faced* Honeyeaters, Black-chinned Honeyeater, White-throated Gerygone, Rufous Whistler, Grey* & Rufous* Fantails, Eastern Yellow & Rose* Robins, Red-browed & Double-barred Finches.*

13. Brisbane Valley Rail Trail—Borallon

Borallon Station Road, Pine Mountain. UBD 171 K18. -27.5311, 152.6908

Section of Brisbane Valley Rail Trail from Borallon Station Road to James Rd, Pine Mountain. Mixed forest with understorey on either side of trail. Flat, unsealed, wide track. Scattered seating near old railway station, and in shelter shed. *Peaceful & Bar-shouldered Doves, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Australian King Parrot, Pale-headed Rosella, Scarlet Honeyeater*, White-throated & Black-chinned Honeyeaters, Spotted Pardalote*, White-browed Scrubwren, White-throated Gerygone, Eastern Whipbird, Grey Shrikethrush, Grey Fantail*, Eastern Yellow & Rose* Robins.*

14. Kamp & Raysource Roads

Junction of Kamp & Raysource Rds, Walloon UBD 210 Q-R1. -27.5809, 152.6600

Site close to Warrego Highway: includes unmaintained Kamp Rd, maintained and unmaintained western section of Raysource Road. Eucalyptus open forest with varying amounts of understorey and mid-storey vegetation; permanent water in dams. Mix of graded gravel road, and quite rough, unformed tracks in unmaintained sections. *Peaceful Dove, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Black-shouldered Kite, Wedge-tailed Eagle, Tawny Frogmouth, Australian Owllet-nightjar, Sacred Kingfisher*, Variegated Fairywren, Scarlet* & Striped Honeyeaters, Yellow-faced* & Fuscous Honeyeaters, Spotted Pardalote, Speckled Warbler, White-browed Scrubwren, White-throated Gerygone, Grey-crowned Babbler, Varied Sittella, Golden Whistler, Grey Shrikethrush, Grey Fantail*, Rose Robin*, Mistletoebird, Double-barred & Red-browed Finches.*

15. Argows Road at Raysource Rd

Corner Argows & Raysource Rds, Haigslea. UBD 170 M20. -27.5782, 152.6422

Site is short distance off Warrego Highway. From Grieves Rd/Raysource Rd intersection, after turning west (right) into Raysource Rd, walk southwest/ left into unformed Argows Rd, a bushy lane. Remnant acacia woodland on verges, scattered forest and farmlands, dams. Undulating with mild to moderate incline, unsealed and uneven track. *Pacific Black Duck, Dusky Moorhen, Australasian Grebe, Straw-necked Ibis, Great & Plumed Egrets, Black-shouldered Kite, Brown Goshawk, Whistling Kite, Sacred Kingfisher*, Striped Honeyeater, White-browed Scrubwren, White-throated Gerygone, Yellow-rumped Thornbill, Yellow Thornbill, Grey-crowned Babbler, Olive-backed Oriole, Grey Fantail*, Tawny Grassbird, Mistletoebird, Double-barred Finch, Australian Pipit.*

16. Black Snake Creek

82 Edmond St, 42 Queen St, Marburg. QBD 170 B17. -27.571193, 152.596233. Note: picnic facilities and toilet are at park opposite Edmond St entry.

Site within section of Upper Black Snake Creek Improvement Project, between 82 Edmond St and 42 Queen St., Marburg, accessed from either end, and also along creek north of Edmond St. Wetland/riparian vegetation, grassland, trees and shrubbery, parkland. Concrete, mostly flat, wheelchair accessible paths. Bench seats along track. *Peaceful & Bar-shouldered Doves, Dusky Moorhen, Australasian Swamphen, Black-fronted Dotterel, Australasian Darter, Little Pied & Little Black Cormorants, White-faced Heron, Straw-necked Ibis, Royal Spoonbill, Black-shouldered Kite, Pale-headed Rosella, Striped Honeyeater, Olive-backed Oriole, Australian Reed Warbler, Tawny Grassbird, Double-barred Finch.*

17. Woolshed Creek Road, Tallegalla

Tallegalla Road and Woolshed Creek Road intersection UBD 209 H2 -27.5867, 152.5430

Easy 1.2km walk westward along slightly undulating, graded gravel Woolshed Creek Rd, from Tallegalla Rd intersection to 124 Woolshed Creek Rd. Mixed habitat including patches of mixed forest, vine thickets, farm dams, transient and permanent ponds. *Pacific Black Duck, Brown Quail, Pheasant Coucal, Peaceful Dove, Bar-shouldered Dove, Little Pied Cormorant, Straw-necked Ibis, White-necked & White-faced Herons, Pale-headed Rosella, Striped Honeyeater, Yellow-faced* & Scarlet* Honeyeaters, White-browed Scrubwren, Eastern Whipbird, Australian Golden Whistler*, Grey Shrike-thrush, Grey Fantail*, Rose Robin*, Golden-headed Cisticola, Silveryeye, Mistletoebird, Double-barred & Red-browed Finches.*

18. Paidley Rd

Paidley Rd, The Bluff. UBD 209 G6. -27.606335, 152.539688

Roadside walk along public road on ridgetop west of Marburg Weather Radar (proceed through first vehicle gate at ridgetop, park and walk 1-2 kms west). Remnant

in advance. Optional walking routes to and from the Billabong using any combination of Wagtail, Whiptail (easiest walking) and Happy Gilmore trails: see track maps online and onsite. *Pacific Black Duck, Brown Quail, Australasian Grebe, Dusky Moorhen, White-faced & White-necked Herons, Pacific Baza, Pale-headed Rosella, White-throated & Striped Honeyeaters, Yellow-faced Honeyeater*, Little Friarbird, Spotted Pardalote*, White-throated Gerygone, Grey-crowned Babbler, Varied Sittella, Australian Golden & Rufous Whistlers, Spangled Drongo, Restless Flycatcher, Red-browed & Double-barred Finches, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

Southern And Eastern Sites

23. Leichhardt Park

1A Old Toowoomba Road, One Mile UBD 232 Q1. -27.6272, 152.7445

Parking at Ernest Street. Habitats: open forest, riverine, parkland and grassland. Sealed, level paths; optional walks closer to river on grass tracks in both Jim Finimore and Leichhardt Parks, latter starting from car park opposite Woodford St. Walks include a circuit route on sealed path around Leichhardt Park and Jim Finimore Park (on opposite side of Old Toowoomba Rd). *Pacific*

Black Duck, Bar-shouldered Dove, Dusky Moorhen, Australian White Ibis, Straw-necked Ibis, Oriental Dollarbird, Little Corella, Blue-faced & White-throated Honeyeater, Grey Fantail*, Tawny Grassbird, Golden-headed Cisticola, Double-barred Finch, Scaly-breasted Munia, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

24. Bremerdale Park

Lot 241, Midland Street, Yamanto UBD 232 M7. -27.6419, 152.7352

Suburban park with bushland, on Bremer River. Mature and regrowth forest, grasslands. Unsealed tracks varying in level from flat to undulating with some steep sections crossing gullies. *Brown Quail, Pheasant Coucal, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Black-shouldered Kite, Straw-necked Ibis, Cattle Egret, White-faced Heron,*

29. Swanbank Lagoon & Environs

Swanbank Coal Road, Swanbank UBD 234 M14-15. -27.6569, 152.8164

Large, constructed lagoon to support Power Station operations. Birding from publicly accessible recreation reserve, and nearby properties. Mixture of wetland, open forest, grassland habitats. Concrete path, gently sloping at beginning, gives easy access to edge of lagoon and most of the reserve.

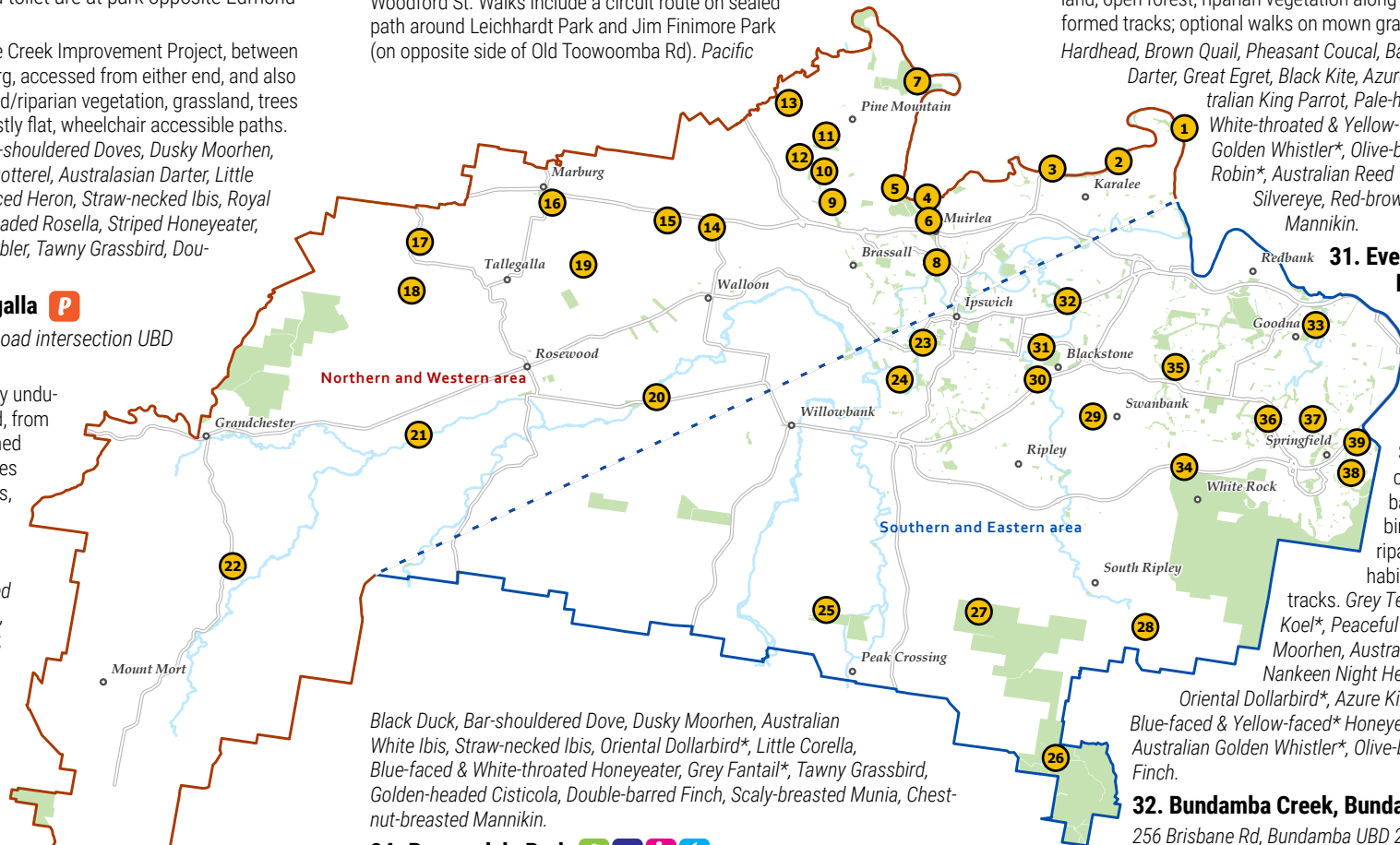

Park with riparian revegetation, grassland, parkland and mature eucalypts along Bundamba Creek, between bridge (corner Brisbane Rd and Mining St.) and Jack Barkley Park and Gledson St. Sealed paths from parking area to Jack Barkley Park; optional extensions on mown grass to bridges at either end of route. *Brown Quail, Channel-billed Cuckoo*, Dusky Moorhen, Straw-necked Ibis, Great Egret, Black Kite, Oriental Dollarbird*,*



vine scrub, open drive. Graded gravel, flat to undulating roadside walk with little traffic. Steep forest with rough spots to reach ridgetop. *Fan-tailed & Brush Cuckoos, Wedge-tailed Eagle, Brown Falcon, Brown Goshawk, Australian King Parrot, Variegated Fairywren, Large-billed & White-browed Scrubwrens, Varied Triller, White-eared Monarch, Leaden Flycatcher*, Eastern Yellow Robin, Red-browed & Double-barred Finches.*

19. Schumanns Road

Schumanns Road, Mt Marrow UBD 210 G5-E4 -27.5959, 152.6085

Walk (steady incline) in either direction between Mount Marrow State School along graded maintained section of Schumanns Rd to dead end; from dead end, additional walk 600 metres westward along unmaintained rough, uneven bush track, with many nesting Rainbow Bee-eaters at western end in spring-summer. Mixed habitat: vine scrub, shrubbery on verges, farmland, dams. *Brown Quail, Dusky Moorhen, Australasian Grebe, Horsfield's Bronze Cuckoo*, Brush Cuckoo*, Peaceful & Bar-shouldered Doves, Straw-necked Ibis, Black-shouldered Kite, Wedge-tailed Eagle, Pale-headed Rosella, Striped & Lewin's Honeyeaters, White-browed Scrubwren, Yellow Thornbill, Varied Triller, Rufous Whistler, Rufous* & Grey* Fantails, Eastern Yellow Robin, Tawny Grassbird, Mistletoebird, Double-barred Finch.*

20. Bremer Road Wetland & Environs

Bremer Road, Jeebropilly UBD 210 K-L16. -27.6490, 152.6378

Shallow freshwater wetland (low in severe drought), grassland, scattered trees; riverine vegetation along nearby Bremer River. Good mixed birding site, particularly for grassland species and raptors, as well as wetland birds. Roadside birding along flat, unsealed and rarely used dead end road. Picnic shelter, tables at nearby Armstrong Park. *Black Swan, Grey Teal, Brown Quail, Pied Stilt, Red-kneed & Black-fronted Dotterels, Comb-crested Jacana, Australian Pied Cormorant, Australasian Darter, Royal Spoonbill, Great & Plumed Egrets, Black-shouldered Kite, Wedge-tailed Eagle, Black Kite, Whistling Kite, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Nankeen Kestrel, Brown Falcon, Striped Honeyeater, Fairy Martin, Golden-headed Cisticola, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin, Australian Pipit.*

21. Waters Road

Waters Road, Calvert UBD 209 H19. -27.6640, 152.5425

Walk roadside west along Waters Road beside Western Creek, for a little over 1 km from the junction with Kuss Road (Lee Bridge). Riparian vegetation, intermittent wetland, open forests and woodlands, farmland with scattered trees and shrubbery, mid and lower storey shrubbery and grassland. Unsealed, level, graded gravel road, frequent traffic at times. *Brown Quail, Bar-shouldered Dove, Peaceful Dove, Pheasant Coucal, Little Black Cormorant, Brown Goshawk, Oriental Dollarbird*, Little Corella, Little Lorikeet, Straw-necked Ibis, Striped & White-throated Honeyeater, Spotted Pardalote*, White-throated Gerygone, Rufous Whistler, Olive-backed Oriole, Grey Fantail*, Tree Martin, Golden-headed Cisticola, Silveryeye, Mistletoebird, Double-barred Finch, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

22. Spicers Hidden Vale Billabong

Located in privately owned Spicers Hidden Vale. Bushland, grassland and wetland birding to and from a wetland (including bird hide, observation platform) in the front section of Hidden Vale. Refreshments and meals can be obtained at onsite café. No fee for track access for private birding visits to Billabong but check in with Spicers Reception is required from 7am or by email before visit. Larger, organized groups of birders should arrange access with Spicers

Best birding is in the mixed plant communities around the eastern, north-eastern and southern edges. 26. Flinders Plum Picnic Ground & Sandy Creek Track, Flinders-Goolman Conservation Estate

Vine scrub, hoop pine forest, dry eucalyptus forest and grassland. Gamlen Circuit, a 3km hilly walk, the picnic area and nearby flat walks, including blue gum and revegetated native bushland (bush tucker), all provide good birding. Predominantly dry eucalyptus open forest, with some lower storey; also creekside vegetation, permanent water. 28. Bayliss Lagoon

Good wetland on private property, stationary viewing from Ripley Road verge. Wetland (dry during droughts), grassland, scattered trees. *Black Swan, Australasian Shoveler, Hardhead, Eurasian Coot, Australasian Swamphen, Australasian Grebe, Black-fronted & Red-kneed Dotterels, Comb-crested Jacana, Black-necked Stork, Australasian Darter, Glossy Ibis, Royal Spoonbill, Great & Plumed Egrets, White-faced & White-necked Herons, Wedge-tailed Eagle, Black & Whistling Kites, White-bellied Sea Eagle.*

View from flat concrete footpath bordering the site. *Brown Quail, Australasian Swamphen, Spotless Crane, Little Pied Cormorant, Australian White Ibis, Great Egret, Black-shouldered Kite, Pacific Baza, Brown Goshawk, Little Corella, Pale-headed Rosella, Yellow-faced* & Scarlet* Honeyeaters, Blue-faced Honeyeater, Little Friarbird, Fairy Martin, Tawny Grassbird, Golden-headed Cisticola, Red-browed & Double-barred Finches, Chestnut-breasted Mannikin.*

36. Woogaroo Creek Bushland
